The matter out of which this Writ Appeal arises was before this Hon'ble Court in W.P.(C) No.10526 of 2018 which was disposed of on 19.03.2024.

MEMORANDUM OF APPEAL:

1. That, the Appellants have preferred the present appeal as they are aggrieved by the order dtd.19.03.2024 passed by the Learned Single Judge disposing the impugned Writ Petition bearing W.P.(C) No.10526 of 2018 in light of the Judgment dtd.06.02.2024 passed in W.A. No. 659 of 2023, as a consequence the Appellant Institute has no other option but to disburse pension benefits to the Respondent-Petitioner w.e.f. 31.10.2012 i.e. next day of his date of retirement notwithstanding the fact that he had already received CPF-Cum-Gratuity benefits amounting to Rs.35,26,485/- after his retirement. It is humbly submitted that the Respondent-Petitioner cannot be extended pension benefits after 12 years of his retirement, moreover, after receiving all the retiral benefits under the CPF-cum-Gratuity

Scheme in as much as the position of law is well settled that **if the request for such belated exercise of option is accepted, the effect would be to permit the respondent to secure the double benefit of both provident fund scheme as also pension scheme, which is unjust and impermissible.** The Appellant Institution in no circumstances is liable to pay pension benefits to the an employee after his retirement who has already voluntarily received benefits under CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme in as much as the position of law is well settled that **on receipt of the entire CPF Amount, the relationship between the employee and employer ceases to exist without leaving any further legal right or obligation qua each other.**

It is absolutely pertinent to mention here that the Respondent-Petitioner with the intention of getting double benefits has filed the impugned writ petition after 6 years of voluntarily receiving all the benefits under the CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme which shows the greedy and illegal conduct of the Respondent-Petitioner therefore no further benefits shall be granted to the Respondent-Petitioner as it would be perverse and impermissible in the eye of law. Thus, from the legal position as stated above, the

order dtd.19.03.2024 passed by the Learned Single Judge allowing the prayer made by the Respondent-Petitioner in W.P.(C) No.10526 of 2018 is a nullity in eye of law and is liable to be quashed in limine.

The Learned Single Judge has disposed of the impugned writ petition vide order dtd.19.03.2024 by relying upon the judgment dtd.06.02.2024 passed in W.A. No. 659 of 2023. The Division Bench of this Hon'ble Court in its judgment dtd.06.02.2024 has upheld the judgment dtd.25.01.2023 passed by the Learned Single Judge in W.P.(C) No.2317 of 2018, allowing the prayer made by Dr.Subhra Keshari Biswal, petitioner in the instant case, who was also a faculty of the Appellant Institution. In the aforementioned writ petition an identical prayer was made as in the impugned writ petition and the Learned Single Judge held that if five employees of the Institute were allowed to change the option from CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme to Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme then similar benefit should be given to the Petitioner as a result the writ petition stands allowed. The judgment dtd.25.01.2023 passed by the Learned Single Judge in W.P.(C) No. 2317 of 2018 was upheld by the Division Bench of this Hon'ble Court in W.A. No.659 of 2023 vide judgment dtd.06.02.2024 which is pending for adjudication in the Hon'ble

Apex Court. However, the impugned writ petition should not have been disposed of by relying upon the judgment dtd.06.02.2024 passed in W.A. No.659 of 2023 since the aforesaid judgment is not applicable to the present case in toto. The Division Bench of this Hon'ble Court rejected the appeal bearing W.A. No.659 of 2023 filed by the present Appellant on the primary ground that there was no document available on record to show the cut-off date fixed by the Institute for changing option from CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme to Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme and the order of rejection passed by the Government against the representation made by the Respondent-Petitioner is not communicated to him.

In the instant case, the Petitioner-Respondent has annexed the Circular dtd.06.04.2004 which clearly shows that final date for exercising option for CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme or Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme is 05.05.2004 and the Respondent-Petitioner had also exercised his option for CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme on 05.05.2004. The Respondent-Petitioner after exercising his option on 05.05.2004 again wrote a representation dtd.14.12.2005 to the Accounts Officer, IGIT Sarang for changing the option from CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme to Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme, but, the

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representation was made after the final list was sent to the Government for approval on 16.11.2004. The Government being the competent authority under the O.C.S. (Pension) Rules, 1992 rightly rejected the representation dtd. 14.12.2005 vide order dtd. 14.02.2011 with the reasoning that once the option is exercised it cannot be re-opened again which has been communicated to the Respondent-Petitioner.

Thus, in view of the facts and circumstances as mentioned above, the judgment dtd. 25.01.2023 passed in W.P.(C) no. 2317 of 2018 which was confirmed by the Hon'ble Division Bench vide judgment dtd. 06.02.2024 in W.A. No. 659 of 2024 cannot act as precedent to the issue involved in the present case although the issues involved in both the writ petitions are identical since the position of law is well settled that **a little difference in facts or additional facts may make a lot of difference to the precedential value of a decision. A judgment of the Court is not to be read as a statute, as it is to be remembered that judicial utterances have been made in setting of facts of a particular case. One Additional or different fact may make a world of difference between the conclusions in two cases. Disposal of cases by blindly placing**

reliance upon a decision is not proper. Thus, from the aforesaid legal point of view, the impugned order dtd.19.03.2024 under Annexure-18 passed by the Learned Single Judge allowing the writ petition by relying upon the judgment dtd.06.02.2024 passed in W.A. No. 659 of 2023 is ex-facie illegal and is liable to be quashed.

2. That IGIT Sarang (hereinafter referred to as the "Institute") previously known as Orissa College of Engineering, is a premier institute in the State of Odisha offering engineering courses at the undergraduate and post-graduate level and is equipped with highly qualified faculties and state of the art laboratories. The Institute imparts technical education with courses and curriculum approved by AICTE, IE and ISTE and has NBA (AICTE) accreditation. The institute was previously managed directly by the Government of Odisha and, since 1987 is managed by the IGIT Society- An autonomous body.
3. That, the Respondent-Petitioner was appointed as Assistant Professor on temporary basis in Civil Engineering Department on 10.09.1984 with an initial pay of Rs.1200 P.M. The Respondent joined in the designated post on 12.09.1984 accepting all the terms and conditions in the order of appointment. The Respondent-Petitioner also signed a

declaration form agreeing to be governed by the CPF-Cum-Gratuity Scheme and to abide by the rules governing the scheme.

Copy of the order of appointment dtd.10.09.1984 issued by the Institute, copy of the Joining Report dtd.12.09.1984 and Copy of the Declaration form is annexed herewith as **Annexure-1, 2 & 3 respectively.**

4. That the management of the society in its 27th meeting took the decision for implementation of CPF/GPF and Pension-cum-gratuity rules for the employees of IGIT Sarang w.e.f. 01.04.1996. The said scheme was approved by the Government in its communication dated 11.01.2000. The Government in the aforementioned communication has conveyed that the State Government will not bear any additional financial liability due to introduction of this scheme over and above the normal grant-in-aid that would have been paid to the Institute had the CPF scheme continued.

A copy of the decision of the Government in the Industries Department dated 11.01.2000 is annexed herewith as **Annexure-4.**

5. That by circular dated 29.01.2000 all the regular employees of the institute were informed to exercise their option for accepting either CPF-cum-Gratuity or pension-cum-gratuity in the prescribed form

within a period of six months from the date of circulation. The Respondent-Petitioner did not exercise any option at the relevant time.

Copy of the circular dated 29.01.2000 is annexed herewith as

Annexure-5.

6. That, fresh options were again invited from the employees of the Institute to choose either the CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme or Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme through a circular dtd.04.07.2002 issued by the Registrar, IGIT Sarang. The Respondent-Petitioner voluntarily decided to be covered under the CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme.

Copy of the Circular dtd.04.07.2002 issued by the Registrar, IGIT Sarang annexed herewith as **Annexure-6.**

7. That, the Institute again invited fresh options vide circular dtd.06.04.2004 from the employees to select either CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme or Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme and the last date for exercising the option was fixed at 05.05.2004. Respondent-Petitioner exercised his option to be covered under the CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme.

Copy of the Circular dtd.06.04.2004 issued by the Registrar, IGIT Sarang and copy of the Option submitted by the Respondent-Petitioner is annexed herewith as **Annexure-7 series**.

8. That, although, 05.05.2004 was fixed as the cut-off date to submit the options for selecting either CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme or Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme, the Institute in order to give its employees adequate opportunities continued to accept representations from employees who wanted to change the option from CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme to Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme. After exercising the option for CPF-cum-Gratuity, five staff members of the Institute through proper channel from 05.05.2004 to 18.10.2004 submitted their application to Appellant No.1 for changing of option from CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme to Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme. These applications were filed by none other than those five members namely Jayanta Kumar Ganthia, Sukadeb Sahoo, Pradip Kumar Dash, Sheshadev Bhuyan and Padma Charan Rout.

Copy of the applications given by the 5 staff members is Annexed herewith as **Annexure-8 Series**.

9. That in the 40th meeting of the Board of Governors, I.G.I.T Sarang dated 30.09.2004 the implementation of pension-cum-Gratuity

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scheme was discussed in detail. It was resolved that the existing employees may be allowed pension-cum-Gratuity or CPF-cum-Gratuity as per the option already exercised. However, fresh employees to be recruited henceforth should be covered under CPF-cum-Gratuity without any scope for opting towards pension scheme.

Copy of the Resolution dated 30.09.2004 is annexed under Annexure-9.

10. That pursuant to the resolution dated 30.09.2004 , a letter Vide No- PA/8/40-395 was sent by the Principal to the Registrar for submitting the List of Staff members who have opted to remain under pension-cum-Gratuity or CPF-cum-Gratuity scheme for Approval of the Government.

Copy of the Letter dated 06.10.2004 vide No- PA/8/40-395 is annexed herewith as Annexure-10.

11. That in furtherance to the communication made by the Registrar, in order to give justice to its employees, the Appellants put all its effort and allowed all the employees to rethink about their option either they will continue under the CPF-cum-Gratuity or Pension-cum-Gratuity scheme according to their choice. The staff members were allowed to exercise their choice on 15.11.2004. The Institute vide letter no.

IGIT/ACCTS/221 sent the list of employees who have opted for pension scheme and CPF Scheme to the Commissioner-cum-Secretary, Industries Department, Government of Orissa, Bhubaneswar. In the above communication it was mentioned that out of 209 staff members who exercised their option, 177 staff members have opted for the Pension-Cum-Gratuity Scheme while 32 staff members opted for the CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme in which list the name of the Respondent No.1 was included. This list was submitted after giving all possible opportunity to the employees with regard to exercising of their option according to their choice. Thus, the option exercised by the Respondent No.1 to remain under CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme was a conscious and voluntary decision according to his own choice. Five employees who were mentioned in the additional affidavit of the Respondent had exercised their option to opt for Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme much before the government approved the Resolution of the BOG and List submitted by the Appellant.

A copy of the Letter dated 16.11.2004 vide no IGIT/ACCTS/221 is annexed herewith as **Annexure-11 Series**.

12. That the Industries Department of the Government of Orissa taking into consideration the approval made in resolution dated 30.09.2004

in the 40th Board of Governors Meeting directed the Principal, I.G.I.T Sarang for the implementation of the Pension Scheme in respect of the five employees who had exercised their option and retired in the meantime to remain under the Pension Scheme along with other 172 Employees who have not retired but opted for the Pension Scheme as per the List submitted by the Appellant vide Letter dated 16.11.2004. This List was approved by the Government on 22.03.2005.

Copy of the Approval Letter dated 22.03.2005 is annexed herewith as **Annexure-12**.

13. That the Respondent having exercised his option to choose CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme as per the list dated 16.11.2004 which was approved by the Government on 23.03.2005, the submission of the application on 14.12.2005 changing the option after the date of approval of the Government, to get the benefit under Pension Scheme by showing the reason that five employees have been granted the benefit under the said scheme was totally unsustainable in law in as much as those five employees had exercised their option much before the date of approval of the Government. Even though such application was not at all entertainable, the Respondent without adhering to the rules of

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procedure gave such application directly to the Principal which was neither approved by his Head of the Department nor routed through the proper channel. At the cost of repetition it is submitted that though not only the Respondent No.1 but nineteen other employees had submitted their applications regarding change of the option from CPF-cum-Gratuity to Pension-cum-Gratuity during 12.03.2005 to 03.09.2009.

Copy of the Application submitted by Respondent-Petitioner to the Registrar of the Institute dated 14.12.2005 is annexed herewith as Annexure-13.

14. That however, the Appellant No.1 on receipt of such applications through Letter dated 12.01.2011 vide No. PA/8-47/18 sent the list of 20 employees including the Respondent to be included in the Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme instead of CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme to the Principal Secretary to Government, Industries Department with reference to the minutes of 46th meeting of the Board of Governors in the 47th Meeting of the Board of governors held on 25.09.2010.

The Board in the 47th Meeting resolved as under:

"The individual cases have been examined and put up in Annexure-I for perusal of the Board."

Board advised the Director to request the Government for consideration to include in pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme”.

15. That the Government in reply to Letter dated 12.01.2011 vide No. PA/8-47/18 intimated the Appellant No.1 that the Government has nothing to say about the inclusion of employees who have opted or CPF-cum-Gratuity into Pension-cum-Gratuity scheme now, as this Department will not bear any financial liability on it. The Government further directed that once the option is exercised it is final and it should not be re-opened again.

Copy of the Letter No. V.FEII-27/2011/2543/I dated 14.02.2011 is annexed herewith as **Annexure-15**.

16. That, it is appropriate to mention here that the Respondent-Petitioner retired on 31.10.2012. After retirement, the Respondent-Petitioner voluntarily accepted the benefits under CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme amounting to Rs.35,26,485/-. The total amount of Rs.35,26,485/- as

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CPF-cum-Gratuity benefits was received by the Respondent-Petitioner under the following heads:

- (i) CPF Matching Share amounting to Rs.16,18,753 credited on 31.10.2012 through cheque.
- (ii) Leave Salary amounting to Rs.11,57,732 credited on 03.11.2012 through Cheque No. 730364.
- (iii) Gratuity amounting to Rs.7,50,000/- credited on 03.11.2012 through Cheque No.730365.

Copy of the documents showing the benefits received by the Respondent-Petitioner is annexed herewith as **Annexure-16 Series**.

17. That after getting all these benefits on his retirement, the Respondent filed W.P.(C) No. 10526 of 2018 after 6 years of his retirement contending that his pension has not yet been released and this action of the Opp.party is discriminatory, *ultra vires* and violative of fundamental rights guaranteed under Article 14,19 and 21 of the Constitution of India and Pension Rules too. The Respondent No.1 filed this writ application by suppressing many material facts which has been disclosed in the preceding paragraphs.

18. That, at this juncture it is appropriate to mention here that the judgment dtd.06.02.2024 passed by this Hon'ble Court in W.A. No

659 of 2023 which has been relied upon by the Learned Single Judge while disposing the impugned writ petition has been stayed by the Hon'ble Apex Court vide its order dtd.12.07.2024 passed in SLP (Civil) Diary No.(s) 22957/2024.

Copy of the order dtd.12.07.2024 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in SLP(Civil) Diary No.(s) 22957 of 2024 is annexed herewith as **Annexure-17**.

19. That the learned Single Judge of this Hon'ble Court without properly examining the facts and the materials available on record as stated above has erroneously allowed the writ petition filed by the respondent and passed the impugned order dtd.19.03.2024 with the following observation:

“ In view of the same the Court is inclined to dispose of the writ petition in the light of the judgment passed on 06.02.2024 in W.A. No. 659 of 2023.”

Copy of the Judgment dtd.19.03.2024 passed by this Hon'ble court in W.P.(C) No. 10526 of 2018 is annexed herewith as **Annexure-18**.

preferred the aforesaid writ appeal
on the following amongst other:-

GROUND

- A) For that the Learned Single Judge has committed material irregularity in allowing the Respondent-Petitioner to get pension benefits after he had voluntarily received the benefits amounting to Rs.35,26,485/- under the CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme. The position of law is well settled that the **on receipt of the entire CPF Amount, the relationship between the employee and employer ceases to exist without leaving any further legal right or obligation qua each other**, thus, no direction can be made to the Appellant to release the pension benefits to the Petitioner after he had already received benefits under CPF Scheme.
- B) For that the Learned Single Judge has passed the impugned order without application of mind in as much as no employee is allowed to get pension benefits after he had voluntarily exercised option to receive benefits under

Pali*

CPF-cum-Gratuity and has already received the entire amount after his retirement. Such an erroneous order passed by the Learned Single is contrary to the settled position of law **if the request for such belated exercise of option is accepted; the effect would be to permit the respondent to secure the double benefit of both provident fund scheme as also pension scheme, which is unjust and impermissible.**

- C) For that the Learned Single Judge has committed gross irregularity in disposing the impugned writ petition by relying upon the judgment dtd.06.02.2024 passed in W.A. No. 659 of 2023 since the facts in the present impugned writ petition are not exactly identical to the facts involved in the writ appeal. The Courts should generally not dispose of writ petitions by relying upon an order passed in an identical matter without properly verifying the facts in as much as the position of law is well settled that **a little difference in facts or additional facts may make a lot of difference to the precedential value of a decision. A judgment of the Court is not to be read as a statute, as it is to be remembered that judicial utterances have been made in setting of facts of a particular case. One Additional or different fact may make a world of difference between the conclusions in two cases.**

D) For that the Learned Single Judge has failed to take into account the vital aspect that the Respondent-Petitioner has filed the impugned writ petition after six years of his retirement with an ulterior motive to get double benefits after the Institute had already granted the benefits under the CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme to the Respondent after his retirement as per the option already exercised by the Petitioner. The aforesaid conduct of the Petitioner not only is a proof of delay and laches on his part but also raises grave suspicion of malafide intention.

E) For that the Learned single judge has failed to take into account the vital fact that the Respondent-Petitioner made application on 10.05.2005 to change option from CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme to Pension -cum-Gratuity Scheme which is after the Government had approved the final list of options on 23.03.2005. The Respondent-Petitioner had exercised his option for CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme on 21.06.2000 and despite getting two opportunities on 04.07.2002 and 06.04.2004 to change his option, the Respondent-Petitioner did not exercise the same. The Respondent-Petitioner decided to apply for change of option to Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme only after the final list of options exercised was approved by the Government on 23.03.2005 which indicates an after thought on the part of the Respondent, thus, the Petitioner cannot be allowed to change the option

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according to whims without following the procedure laid down by the Competent Authorities.

RELIEF SOUGHT FOR

- (i) The appeal be admitted,
- (ii) LCR be called
- (iii) And after hearing, the appeal be allowed by setting aside the impugned order dated 19.03.2024 passed by the Learned Single Judge in W.P. (C) No.10526 of 2018 under Annexure- 18.

Subsequently the registered society was formed. Since then the Institute is managed, administered, and run by a Governing Body headed by the Hon'ble Minister of Industries under Society Registration Act, 1860. Government is providing the required funds for Recurring and Non-Recurring expenses in shape of Grant-in-aid. A copy of the resolution No.VTTL 30/03 -6407 /I dated, 16th March, 1983 of Industries Department, Government of Orissa is enclosed herewith for your kind perusal.

It is an obligation of the Institute to extend the terminal benefits to staff members those who were recruited / appointed and brought on deputation from Government organizations and subsequently merged with the Institute service.

In fact, the Government had approved the scheme of "Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme" to extend the Terminal Benefits to the staff members of the Institute from its own resources, which were seen to be not viable due to the falling down of the interest rate at national level, on investment.


The Board of Governors in its 40th Meeting held on 30-09-2004, once again resolved and recommended that the existing employees may be allowed Pension/CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme as per option already exercised like U.C.E, Burla (Copy enclosed) and fresh employees to be recruited should be covered under C.P.F-cum-gratuity without any scope for opting towards pension scheme. As per the decision of the Govt. of Orissa in Industries Department vide letter No. VTII-1/99-698 dt 11.01.2000 the scheme will be implemented with effect from 01-01-1996 and options have already been received from the employees of the Institute.

In this connection, it is to mention here that out of 209 nos of total employees 32 nos. have opted for Contributory Provident Fund-Gratuity Scheme and 177 have opted for Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme and it is calculated that an amount Rs.4,62,908.00 is required under Pension/CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme during the year 2005-06.

In the mean time, a few employees have been retired from the Institute on superannuation. They have already exercised their option for getting pensionary benefits. Due to paucity of funds the Institute is unable to pay the pensionary benefits till date. As a result a few of them have taken shelter in the Court of Law and representing the higher authorities from time to time.

In view of the above I would, request to kindly accord Government permission to implement the Scheme in this Institute.

I, Jagannath Prasad Behera aged about 72 years S/o Late Natabar Behera, presently retired as a Professor of Civil Engineering, Indira Gandhi Institute of Technology, Vill-Mukundapur, PO-Chandol, PS/Dist-Kendrapara do hereby solemnly affirm and state on oath as under:

1. That, I am the Respondent No-1 in this present W.A. and petitioner in the writ petition before the Hon'ble Single Judge of the Hon'ble Orissa High Court. I have gone through the averments with grounds taken in the W.A.
2. That, in light of the ruling in **W.P.(C) No. 10526/2018**, which was disposed of based on the judgment in **W.A. No. 659 of 2023**, it is evident that the present appeal in **W.A. No. 2126/2024** involves an identical matter with similar issues. As there is no new argument or undisputed fact presented in this case, the grounds raised in the current appeal have already been fully adjudicated in **W.A. No. 659 of 2023**.

Therefore, this **W.A. No. 2126/2024** lacks a fresh cause of

action and should be dismissed to maintain judicial consistency and uphold the principles established in the earlier decision. The Additional Secretary, Law, in their noting, has advised against challenging the judgment dated 06.02.2024 passed in W.A. No. 659 of 2023 and has instead recommended its implementation. Therefore, filing this Writ Appeal is contrary to the decision of the Law Department/Government of Odisha. The noting on File No. LAW-LR-CASE-0166-2024 is submitted herewith as Annexure-A/R₁ to this objection affidavit.

3. That, In **Ground-A**, the appellant argues that the respondent has already received retirement benefits under the CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme. However, the appellant, as the respondent's employer, failed to properly account for or deposit CPF contributions, thus depriving the respondent of eligibility for benefits under either the Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme or the CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme. The appellant lacks any documentary evidence proving the respondent's coverage under the CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme, and as a non-authorized institution, the appellant was not legally entitled to hold or manage CPF contributions. Therefore, the appellant's claim that the respondent received retirement benefits under CPF is baseless and unsupported by law, as any amount purportedly received cannot be deemed lawful CPF benefits. This failure to fulfil statutory obligations makes the appellant's grounds untenable, rendering the current W.A. without merit and subject to dismissal.

4. That in **Ground-B** the appellant argues that the Respondent's case differs from that of five other employees allowed to switch to the Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme due to unique circumstances. However, it rightly points out that no specific cut-off date for reversing the CPF option was communicated, leaving room for fair re-evaluation. The precedent of extending benefits to similarly situated employees establishes a standard of equitable treatment, and denying Respondent's request on procedural grounds would violate principles of fairness and parity. Contrary to the appellants' claim that Respondent No-1 would receive "double benefits" by switching, the respondent has in fact been deprived of any pension coverage under either the Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme or CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme. Therefore, the appellant's arguments lack merit, and **Ground B** in the current W.A. is baseless and unsustainable in law, justifying the dismissal of the appeal.
5. That, in **Grounds C and D**, the appellants argue that Respondent's case is not identical to **W.A. No. 659/2023** and cite delay, as the writ petition was filed six years after his retirement. However, this claim is incorrect: His **W.P.(C) No. 10526 of 2018** was filed when his representations were neither rejected nor allowed, the process was continued after his retirement on 31.10.2012, the delay of considering his pension making it identical in context and cause to **W.A. No. 659/2023**, involving the same employer and issue of changing

the pension option. Furthermore, the matter of pension constitutes a continuous cause of action. In **Civil Appeal No. 4134 of 2022** (*Rushibhai Jagdishchandra Pathak vs. Bhavnagar Municipal Corporation*), the Hon'ble Supreme Court affirmed that delay does not bar legitimate pension claims, especially where no third-party rights are affected, and highlighted the need for equity and justice in cases involving state pensioners. Thus, the delay in filing for pension benefits cannot be grounds for dismissal, and the present W.A. should be dismissed as unsustainable.

6. That, in **Ground E**, the appellant claims that the government approved a final list of options on 23.03.2005 and asserts that the respondent chose the CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme on 21.06.2000, with opportunities to change this option on 04.07.2002 and 06.04.2004, which he did not utilize. However, this ground is flawed as there was no formal notification specifying a cut-off date for switching from CPF-cum-Gratuity to the Pension-cum-Gratuity Scheme. Without a defined cut-off date, there was no clear restriction on changing options, leaving room for re-evaluation based on equitable grounds. Consequently, the appellant's argument lacks validity, and **Ground E** fails to support the appeal, which should therefore be dismissed.

7. Establishing Parity with Precedents

- The argument relies heavily on the precedent set in **W.P.(C) No. 2317 of 2018**, upheld by the Division Bench in **W.A. No. 659 of 2023**.

- Highlight that the court in these cases recognized the right of similarly situated employees to change their scheme preference, affirming that when a group of employees has been allowed to switch to a pension scheme, equity demands extending similar relief to all others in the same category.
- Stress the principle of non-discriminatory treatment and equal application of benefits among similar employees, which is in line with Article 14 of the Constitution of India.

8. Response to the CPF-cum-Gratuity Scheme Argument

- While the appellant argues that accepting CPF benefits finalizes employer-employee relations, highlight that:
 - The decision to accept CPF benefits did not fully reflect the Respondent's preference for a secure retirement benefit scheme.
 - The option to switch to the pension scheme would provide long-term stability and is justifiable given the subsequent developments and precedents allowing for such a switch in analogous cases.
 - Courts have, in similar cases, ruled that if the option exercise period was unclear or not well-communicated, affected employees should have the chance to reassess their choice, particularly when pension regulations impact retirement security.

9. Delay in Representation and Cut-off Date Issue

- Respond to the appellant's claim that Respondent's representation to switch schemes was made post cut-off by underscoring the **lack of proper and timely communication from the institute** regarding this final decision date.
- If it can be shown that this Respondent or others like him were not clearly informed of a hard deadline, the delayed representation should

be considered as legitimate, as the right to a secure pension cannot be nullified solely due to procedural ambiguity.

- Emphasize that administrative errors and lack of transparency should not disadvantage employees seeking fair retirement benefits.

10. Rejection of "Double Benefit" Argument

- Address the allegation that this Respondent is pursuing "double benefits" by requesting a pension. Make it clear that this is not an attempt at "double dipping" but rather a fair re-evaluation of the retirement benefits to align with the **retirement security framework applied to similarly situated employees.**
- Reiterate that this request is grounded in fairness and the principle of parity, not greed, and it aligns with the precedent where other employees were allowed to switch schemes despite initially receiving CPF benefits.

11. Supreme Court Stay and Impact

- Acknowledge that the **Supreme Court stay on W.A. No. 659 of 2023** temporarily halts the precedent's applicability. However, argue that this stay does not undermine the rationale or the substantive legal basis behind the High Court's initial ruling favouring the switch to the pension scheme.
- Emphasize that the pending status does not negate the High Court's consistent stance on providing pension benefits, particularly when fairness and non-discrimination are at stake. The respondent's claim remains valid until a final decision is reached.

12.. Legal Principles of Consistency and Equity

- Highlight that the hon'ble courts prioritize consistency and equity in employment benefits. The respondent's request to change from the CPF


to the Pension Scheme follows these principles, especially given his prolonged service and retirement rights.

- Hon'ble Courts have supported employees' rights to equitable retirement benefits, even if it requires revisiting initial decisions to achieve fairness and security.

13. That in conclusion, the counter should assert that the Respondent's request for pension benefits aligns with prior judicial decisions, respects the principles of fairness, and upholds his right to a secure retirement. His case does not constitute an exception but rather conforms to established legal precedents allowing equitable treatment of employees in similar situations. The dismissal of the W.A. appeal should be advocated, with emphasis on the respondent's long-standing contributions and the fundamental right to equal treatment under established retirement schemes.


14. That the respondent denies the points and grounds raised in the present Writ Appeal as baseless and unsustainable in law. Each ground asserted by the appellant lacks merit, particularly in light of established legal principles and precedents on pension rights and equitable treatment. The respondent respectfully submits that the issues presented in this Writ Appeal are identical to those previously adjudicated, rendering the current appeal liable for dismissal. However, should the Hon'ble Court deem it necessary, the respondent prays for the liberty to file a detailed counter-affidavit to address and clarify any specific points raised in the Writ Appeal. The facts state above are true to the best of my knowledge and belief.



The A/D have endorsed the file seeking views of this Department to challenge the judgment dt.06.02.2024 passed in W.A. No.659 of 2023 arising out of the judgment dt.25.01.2023 passed in WP(C) No.2317 of 2018 by the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa, Cuttack, filed by Dr. Subhra Keshari Biswal.

While disposing the WP(C) No.2317 of 2018, Hon'ble High Court of Orissa (Single Bench) have directed that *"If the five employees named in the additional affidavit filed by the IGIT, who were allowed to change their option to the pension scheme have actually been granted such benefits, the same benefit should also be granted to the petitioner subject to such formalities as the authorities may deem fit and proper to insist."*

The above order was challenged on the ground that the petitioner submitted his application to opt for the pension-cum-gratuity scheme at a much later stage, which show that it was an afterthought. Dismissing the W.A. No.659 of 2023, Hon'ble Court (Division Bench) held that the judgment dt.25.01.2023 delivered in WP(C) No.2317 of 2018 does not suffer infirmity.

The petitioner has a right to opt for pension-cum- gratuity, but he submitted his application at a much later stage. It does not take away his right to be covered under the Pension-cum-Gratuity scheme, which is already available to the similarly placed employees. Permitting some of the employees to avail the scheme and not permitting the petitioner on the ground that he has applied it lately would definitely result in discrimination. In that view, there is no scope to challenge the judgment dt.06.02.2024 passed in W.A. No.659 of 2023. The A/D may be advised to implement the same.
