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SYNOPSIS

- By way of the present writ petition, your Petitioner has been constrained to approach this Hon'ble Court invoking its extra-ordinary jurisdiction vested under Articles 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India, 1950 challenging the Show-Cause Notice No. 10/2023-SLES/3601/Mines dated 19.11.2024 ("Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024") and consequential Demand vide Notice No. VII (C) 10/2023(SLES)-3664/Mines dated 27.11.2024 ("Impugned Demand Notice dated 27.11.2024") issued by the Deputy Director of Mines, Joda Circle, Keonjhar for being issued in complete and brazen violation of the very principles of natural justice, as well as being bad in law, arbitrary, unreasonable, and hit by Articles 14, 19(1)(g) and 300-A of the Constitution of India, 1950.
- The Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 and the consequential Impugned Demand Notice dated 27.11.2024 are in flagrant violation of the principles of natural justice for the following reasons:
 - a. The Reports, which formed the foundation for the allegations in the showcause notice were not shared despite repeated requests by the Petitioner;
 - b. In the absence of the documents/reports forming the foundation of the allegations, the allegations in the Impugned Show-Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 are wholly vague and unintelligible in nature.
 - c. The Impugned Demand Notice dated 27.11.2024 is a cryptic and unreasoned order, which has been passed on the very same day as the Petitioner filed its preliminary response without any application of mind and with total disregard to the response furnished by the Petitioner;

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- d. The entire process has been conducted as an empty formality with a premeditated mindset which is evident from the prejudicial and unusually hasty manner in which the Petitioner was denied a fair and effective opportunity of being heard; and
- e. That apart from the fact that the Petitioner was not given copies of the Reports on the basis of which the Show-Cause Notice was issued, the Petitioner was not even afforded an opportunity of personal hearing;
- f. The arbitrary and biased approach of the Opposite Parties is especially evident since the subject matter of the dispute is complex and technical in nature. In view of the absence of foundational documents and the unreasonably short time granted, the Petitioner's ability to present a fair and effective response, further exacerbates the prejudice caused.
- 3. That, the following facts in brief would demonstrate the aforesaid patent breach of principles of natural justice by the Opposite Party State:
 - (i) The Petitioner is the leaseholder of Jajang Mining Block in the State of Odisha.
 - (ii) On 03.07.2024 and 04.07.2024, an inspection was purportedly conducted by the State Level Enforcement Squad (SLES). The Petitioner asserts that the constitution of the said SLES has never been provided to the Petitioner, and it reserves the jurisdiction and authority of the SLES to even carry out such an inspection.
 - (iii) Pursuant thereto, a show cause notice dated 29.08.2024 was issued to the Petitioner wherein, two allegations were raised "as per joint inspection report conducted by SLES team" at the Petitioner's Jajang

Iron Ore Block. *Ex facie*, the two allegations raised in this show-cause notice are vague, unclear and completely un-intelligible, particularly because the so-called joint inspection report was not annexed with the show-cause notice.

- (iv) On 04.09.2024, the Petitioner responded requesting for a copy of the joint inspection report so that it could understand the allegations being made in the said show-cause notice and respond to them.
- (v) Strangely, for over 2 months, the Petitioner received no communication whatsoever from the State authorities.
- (vi) Thereafter, out of the blue, another show-cause notice was issued on 19.11.2024. This new allegation is now stated to be on the basis of two reports, *firstly*, Joint inspection report conducted by SLES team earlier; and *secondly*, a new report submitted by a Committee (headed by Mining Officer) constituted on 30.08.2024.
- (vii) The Petitioner was granted a mere seven days' time to respond to this new allegation vis-a-vis purported discrepancies related to 16 stacks of ore, again without the Petitioner being given a copy of either (a) the joint inspection report of SLES; or (b) the new Report by the Committee headed by the Mining Officer.
- (viii) Pertinently, while the aforesaid show cause notice granted seven days to furnish a reply, it strangely scheduled personal hearing on 22.11.2024 after three days at 11:30am. This unequivocally demonstrates that the entire show cause was pre-meditated, a mechanical exercise and an empty formality.

- (ix) On 22.11.2024, the Petitioner responded to the show cause notice dated 19.11.2024 and highlighted that neither the SLES Report, the Stack details nor the report prepared by the committee constituted by the DDM/ Opposite party No. 2 has been supplied to the Petitioner. Without such reports, the Petitioner would not be in a position to verify the alleged discrepancies in the show-cause from its end and furnish an effective reply.
- (x) In reply, on 25.11.2024, the DDM/ Opposite party No. 2 issued a cryptic response fixing the personal hearing to 27.11.2024. However strangely, neither the SLES Report nor the Committee Report were provided to the Petitioner despite express requests.
- (xi) Dismayed by the repeated refusal to provide the two reports in question, the Petitioner vide email dated 27.11.2024 at 7:02 pm, submitted a brief preliminary reply, again stating that in the absence of the two reports, it was unable to properly understand the allegation in Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 and thus not able to effectively respond to it.
- (xii) In the said reply, handicapped as it was due to non-provision of the Reports, the Petitioner to the best of its limited understanding disputed any discrepancies with respect to the said stacks of ore. The Petitioner also clarified that all the stacks in question had been duly verified by the Mining Officer, and permissions for despatch thereof were issued following the payment of royalty and other statutory dues and there is no discrepancy as alleged.

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- (xiii) Shockingly, on 27.11.2024 itself, without even affording the Petitioner an opportunity of personal hearing, the Opposite Party No. 2 issued the Impugned Demand of around Rs. 155 crores on surmises and conjectures without providing the Petitioner the said reports as requested or allowing it any opportunity to respond to the allegations in detail. In fact, the Impugned Demand does not even attempt to engage with the Petitioner's reply and rejects it cryptically stating "not satisfactory". Even more shockingly, the Demand Notice, which appears to be pre-drafted states "...after receive of the report submitted by the internal squad on dt. 07.11.2024...., you have taken permission to dispatch". The said statement is completely false inasmuch as no report has ever been shared with the Petitioner, despite repeated requests.
- 4. As the above sequence of facts lucidly demonstrate, the entire show-cause proceedings initiated from 19.11.2024 to its culmination in the Impugned Demand on 27.11.2024 has been conducted in a mechanical pre-meditated manner. Even though the Petitioner repeatedly requested for the said reports, which admittedly formed the basis of the show-cause proceedings, the same were not provided to it. The same unequivocally demonstrates that the whole proceeding was a premeditated exercise and an empty formality in egregious violation of principles of natural justice. In such circumstances, the Petitioner has been constrained to approach this Hon'ble Court to set aside the entire show-cause proceedings as well as Impugned Demand.

(Annexure 10 at pg 10,26,07,203/- towards royalty, Rs.75,24,52,823/- towards 193) Premium, Rs.1,02,60,721/- towards DMF, Rs. 20,52,144/towards NMET within 7 days of issuance of the Demand Notice. Pertinently, in the Impugned Demand Notice, the Opposite party No. 2 has not engaged with any of the points raised by the Petitioner in its preliminary reply, and has dismissed the same cryptically stating "not satisfactory". The Impugned Demand Notice prepared and signed on dated 27.11.2024 has been received by the Petitioner through e-mail from DDM on dated 28.11.2024 at 1.52 P.M.

The matter out of which this writ application arises was never before this Hon'ble Court in any manner whatsoever as per the instruction received from the Petitioners.

The Hon'ble Chief Justice of Orissa High Court and His Lordship's Companion Justices of the said Hon'ble Court.

The humble petition of the Petitioners above named;

MOST RESPECTFULLY SHEWETH:

- 1. That, by means of the present Writ Petition, the Petitioner has been constrained to approach this Hon'ble Court invoking its extraordinary jurisdiction vested under Articles 226 and 227 of the



Constitution of India, 1950 challenging the Show-Cause Notice No. 10/2023-SLES/3601/Mines dated 19.11.2024 ("Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024") and consequential Demand vide Notice No. VII (C) 10/2023(SLES)-3664/Mines dated 27.11.2024 ("Impugned Demand Notice dated 27.11.2024") issued by the Deputy Director of Mines, Joda Circle, Keonjhar for being issued in complete and brazen violation of the very principles of natural justice, as well as being bad in law, arbitrary, unreasonable, and hit by Articles 14, 19(1)(g) and 300-A of the Constitution of India, 1950.

The Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 and the consequential Impugned Demand Notice dated 27.11.2024 are in flagrant violation of the principles of natural justice for the following reasons:

×.

 a. The Reports, which formed the foundation for the allegations in the show-cause notice were not shared despite repeated requests by the Petitioner;



- b. In the absence of the documents/reports forming the foundation of the allegations, the allegations in the Impugned Show-Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 are wholly vague and unintelligible in nature.
- c. The Impugned Demand Notice dated 27.11.2024 is a cryptic and unreasoned order, which has been passed on the very same day as the Petitioner filed its preliminary response without any application of mind and with total disregard to the response furnished by the Petitioner;
- d. The entire process has been conducted as an empty formality with a pre-meditated mindset which is evident from the prejudicial and unusually hasty manner in which the Petitioner was denied a fair and effective opportunity of being heard; and
- e. That apart from the fact that the Petitioner was not given copies of the Reports on the basis of which the Show-Cause Notice was issued, the Petitioner was not even afforded an opportunity of personal hearing;
- f. The arbitrary and biased approach of the Opposite Parties is especially evident since the subject matter of the dispute is



x,

complex and technical in nature. In view of the absence of foundational documents and the unreasonably short time granted, the Petitioner's ability to present a fair and effective response, further exacerbates the prejudice caused.

- That, the following facts in brief would demonstrate the aforesaid patent breach of principles of natural justice by the Opposite Party State:
 - (i) The Petitioner is the leaseholder of Jajang Mining Block in the State of Odisha.
 - (ii) On 03.07.2024 and 04.07.2024, an inspection was purportedly conducted by the State Level Enforcement Squad (SLES). The Petitioner asserts that the constitution of the said SLES has never been provided to the Petitioner, and it reserves the jurisdiction and authority of the SLES to even carry out such an inspection.
 - (iii) Pursuant thereto, a show cause notice dated 29.08.2024 was issued to the Petitioner wherein, two allegations were raised *"as per joint inspection report conducted by SLES team"* at



the Petitioner's Jajang Iron Ore Block. *Ex facie*, the two allegations raised in this show-cause notice are vague, unclear and completely un-intelligible, particularly because the socalled joint inspection report was not annexed with the showcause notice.

- (iv) On 04.09.2024, the Petitioner responded requesting for a copy of the joint inspection report so that it could understand the allegations being made in the said show-cause notice and respond to them.
- (v) Strangely, for over 2 months, the Petitioner received no communication whatsoever from the State authorities.
- (vi) Thereafter, out of the blue, another show-cause notice was issued on 19.11.2024. This new allegation is now stated to be on the basis of two reports, *firstly*, Joint inspection report conducted by SLES team earlier; and *secondly*, a new report submitted by a Committee (headed by Mining Officer) constituted on 30.08.2024.

The Petitioner was granted a mere seven days' time to respond to this new allegation vis-a-vis purported



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discrepancies related to 16 stacks of ore, again without the Petitioner being given a copy of either (a) the joint inspection report of SLES; or (b) the new Report by the Committee headed by the Mining Officer.

- (vii) Pertinently, while the aforesaid show cause notice granted seven days to furnish a reply, it strangely scheduled personal hearing on 22.11.2024 after three days at 11:30am. This unequivocally demonstrates that the entire show cause was pre-meditated, a mechanical exercise and an empty formality.
- (viii) On 22.11.2024, the Petitioner responded to the show cause notice dated 19.11.2024 and highlighted that neither the SLES Report, the Stack details nor the report prepared by the committee constituted by the DDM/ Opposite party No. 2 has been supplied to the Petitioner. Without such reports, the Petitioner would not be in a position to verify the alleged discrepancies in the show-cause from its end and furnish an effective reply.
- (ix) In reply, on 25.11.2024, the DDM/ Opposite party No. 2 issued a cryptic response fixing the personal hearing to



27.11.2024. However strangely, neither the SLES Report nor the Committee Report were provided to the Petitioner despite express requests.

- (x) Dismayed by the repeated refusal to provide the two reports in question, the Petitioner vide email dated 27.11.2024 at 7:02 pm, submitted a brief preliminary reply, again stating that in the absence of the two reports, it was unable to properly understand the allegation in Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 and thus not able to effectively respond to it.
- (xi) In the said reply, handicapped as it was due to non-provision of the Reports, the Petitioner to the best of its limited understanding disputed any discrepancies with respect to the said stacks of ore. The Petitioner also clarified that all the stacks in question had been duly verified by the Mining Officer, and permissions for despatch thereof were issued following the payment of royalty and other statutory dues and there is no discrepancy as alleged.

(xii) Shockingly, on 27.11.2024 itself, without even affording the Petitioner an opportunity of personal hearing, the Opposite Party No. 2 issued the Impugned Demand of around Rs. 155 crores on surmises and conjectures without providing the Petitioner the said reports as requested or allowing it any opportunity to respond to the allegations in detail. In fact, the Impugned Demand does not even attempt to engage with the Petitioner's reply and rejects it cryptically stating "not satisfactory". Even more shockingly, the Demand Notice, which appears to be pre-drafted states "...after receive of the report submitted by the internal squad on dt. 07.11.2024...., you have taken permission to dispatch". The said statement is completely false inasmuch as no report has ever been shared with the Petitioner, despite repeated requests.

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As the above sequence of facts lucidly demonstrate, the entire show-cause proceedings initiated from 19.11.2024 to its culmination in the Impugned Demand on 27.11.2024 has been conducted in a mechanical pre-meditated manner. Even though the Petitioner repeatedly requested for the said reports, which admittedly formed



the basis of the show-cause proceedings, the same were not provided to it. The same unequivocally demonstrates that the whole proceeding was a premeditated exercise and an empty formality in egregious violation of principles of natural justice. In such circumstances, the Petitioner has been constrained to approach this Hon'ble Court to set aside the entire show-cause proceedings as well as Impugned Demand.

3. That the Petitioner is a Company registered under the provisions of the Companies Act, 1956 having its registered Office P.O. Bandra-Kurla Complex. Bandra (E), P.S. Bandra, Dist. Mumbai Maharashtra – 400051. The Petitioner is being represented by its General Manager (Legal) who has been duly authorized by virtue of Power of Attorney dated 12.07.2024. The Petitioner is one of the pioneer manufacturers of iron and steel in the country and current leaseholder of Jajang Mining Block situated in the State of Odisha.

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That the Deputy Director of Mines, Joda, Keonjhar (DDM/ Opposite Party No. 2) is the authority which issued the Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 and consequential Impugned

Demand dated 27.11.2024. All the Opposite Parties are the functionaries of the State Government and therefore, fall within the meaning of 'State' under Article 12 of the Constitution of India. The Opposite Parties are amenable to the writ jurisdiction of this Hon'ble Court.

- That the cause of action for filing the present Writ Petition arises within the territorial jurisdiction of this Hon'ble Court.
- 6. That the facts leading to the filing of the present writ application are as follows:
- a. The State Government of Odisha, in accordance with Section 8A of the Mine and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 ("MMDR Act, 1957") and the relevant Rules thereunder, issued a Notice Inviting Tender ("NIT") on 06.12.2019 for auction of 20 mining blocks, including the Jajang Iron Ore Block. In the ensuing auction, the Petitioner Company emerged as the successful bidder for the Jajang Iron Ore Block. Consequently, on 27.06.2020, after deposit of statutory dues, the State Government executed the lease



deed for the mining block in favour of the Petitioner for a period of fifty years.

A copy of the Mining Lease Deed of the Petitioner for Jajang Mining Block is annexed herewith as <u>Annexure-1</u>.

- b. That thereafter, the Petitioner commenced mining operations, strictly complying with the statutory provisions as set out in the MMDR Act, 1957, MCR, 2016 and Orissa Minerals (Prevention of Theft, Smuggling and Illegal Mining and Regulation of Possession, Shortage and Transportation) Rules, 2007 ("OMPTS Rules, 2007") framed under Section 23C of the MMDR Act, 1957.
- c. That all dispatches by the Petitioner from its mining block are effected only on issuance of lifting permission and transit permits by the competent authority under the OMPTS Rules, 2007. The entire process is strictly regulated, supervised and is always preceded by not only grade analysis done in a government laboratory to determine the grade of ore, but also physical inspection and verification by the Senior Inspector of Mines as per the procedure specified under Rule 10 of the OMPTS Rules, 2007 read with the



Operational Guidelines dated 28.04.2021 notified by the Steel & Mines Department, Govt. of Odisha.

d. That, it may not be out of place to also note that the ore produced from the Mine is and can only be dispatched after due payment of, royalty, DMF, NMET and other statutory dues, pursuant to which transit passes for removal of ore from the leasehold area is issued by the statutory authorities. After removal of ore, the Premium is paid on monthly basis. The Petitioner has also been diligently filing its daily, monthly and annual statutory returns with the Indian Bureau of Mines and other authorities showing its detailed production and despatch figures in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.

Inspection by State Level Enforcement Squad and First Show Cause Notice

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That while the matters stood thus, an inspection was conducted by State Level Enforcement Squad ("SLES") in respect of the subject mine on 03.07.2024 and 04.07.2024. It is stated that report pursuant



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to the inspection ("SLES Report") or findings thereof were not intimated to the Petitioner Company.

f. Thereafter, the DDM/ Opposite Party No. 2 issued a show cause notice dated 29.08.2024 purportedly based on the SLES Report and sought justifications from the Petitioner to explain the alleged violations. Pertinently, it stated that 84 balance stacks were available in the leasehold area, as opposed to 341 nos. of balance stacks in the year 2022-23, 113 nos. of balance stacks in 2023-24 and 110 nos. of balance stacks in 2024-25 (as on 04.07.2024) as per "i3MS Report". On this alleged so-called discrepancy between SLES Report and i3MS data, the show-cause notice presumed that the Petitioner has somehow despatched the balance quantity of ore without obtaining transit pass. The allegations are bald, vague and appear to be mere surmises. Strangely, the SLES Report, which clearly formed the sole foundation of the aforesaid show cause notice was not enclosed therewith or was ever provided to the Petitioner.



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A copy of show cause notice vide File No. 10/2023-SLES 2884/Mines dated 29.08.2024 issued by the DDM/ Opposite Party No. 2 is annexed herewith as Annexure-2.

That, in response, on 04.09.2024, the Petitioner issued a letter to g. DDM/ Opposite party No. 2 categorically stating that the copy of the SLES Report was not included as part of the show cause notice dated 29.08.2024 due to which the Petitioner was unable to fully comprehend the so-called allegations made by the SLES team which are reflected in the show-cause notice. Accordingly, the Petitioner requested for a copy of SLES Report as well as an extension of seven days from the date such documents are furnished to enable it to verify the data and submit a comprehensive reply.

A copy of the Petitioner's letter dated 04.09.2024 vide Ref. No. JSW/JIOM/2024-25/124 is annexed herewith as Annexure-3.

Issuance of Fresh/ Second Show Cause Notice and Demand Notice

That, the Petitioner did not receive any response to the aforesaid letter for nearly two months.



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- That, out of the blue, on 19.11.2024, the DDM/ Opposite party No. 2 issued another show cause notice ("Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024"). In the said Show-Cause Notice, the Opposite party No. 2 has stated that based on the findings in the SLES Report, another committee headed by the Mining Officer was formed on 30.08.2024. The said Committee purportedly went through the SLES Report and verified in the field and reported that 16 stacks are not available in their designated coordinates. However, as with the earlier show-cause notice, the present show-cause notice also did not enclose the SLES Report nor the report of the present Committee and was again vague, bald and unintelligible in the absence of the reports referred therein.
- j. That, as a consequence, the Petitioner remained wholly in dark about the findings of the Committee and the methodology adopted, or any other data whatsoever to arrive at such allegations. It is reiterated that while even the Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 relied upon the SLES Report as the foundation, neither the SLES



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Report nor the present Committee Report was provided to the Petitioner.

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That, apart, it is also relevant to highlight that while the Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 granted seven days to furnish a reply, it strangely scheduled the personal hearing on 22.11.2024 just after three days at 11:30 am. This unequivocally demonstrates that the entire show cause was pre-meditated, a mechanical exercise and entire proceedings an empty formality.

A copy of show cause notice *vide* File No. 10/2023-SLES3601/Mines dated 19.11.2024 issued by the DDM/ Opposite Party No. 2 is annexed herewith as <u>Annexure-4</u>.

I. That, on 22.11.2024, the Petitioner responded to the show cause notice dated 19.11.2024 and highlighted that neither the SLES Report nor the report prepared by the committee constituted by the DDM/ Opposite party No. 2 has been supplied to the Petitioner. Without such reports, the Petitioner is not in a position to verify the discrepancies, if at all from its end and furnish an effective reply.



Therefore, the Petitioner requested the DDM/ Opposite party No. 2 to provide copies of both the reports and further to grant at least two weeks' time thereafter to review the documents and furnish a comprehensive reply.

A copy of the Petitioner's letter dated 22.11.2024 *vide* Ref. No. JSW/S/CO/2024/695 is annexed herewith as <u>Annexure- 5</u>.

m. That, in reply, on 25.11.2024, the DDM/ Opposite party No. 2 fixed the personal hearing to 27.11.2024 and asking to submit the reply on or before 27.11.2024 stating that no further time will be given in this matter. However, neither the SLES Report nor the Committee Report were provided to the Petitioner.

A copy of letter *vide* File No. 10/2023-SLES3650/Mines dated 25.11.2024 issued by the DDM/ Opposite Party No. 2 is annexed herewith as <u>Annexure- 6</u>.

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That, handicapped as it was due to non-provision of the Reports, the Petitioner left with no alternative filed a preliminary response categorically highlighting the effective denial of principles of natural



justice in the instituted proceedings and further placed the following objections:

- The Committee Report, the SLES Report, as well as the details of the stacks referenced in the show cause notice, were not provided to JSW.
- ii. Despite seeking two weeks to file a reply, the DDM granted only a single day's extension.
- iii. As far as the allegations on merits were concerned, to its limited understanding, the Petitioner stated that of the 16 stacks under scrutiny, 11 were old stacks that had been lying within the lease area for over a year, either due to lapses or repeated re-permissions. Moreover, most of these stacks had either been dispatched or were under the process of dispatch following due permission or re-permission granted under prescribed Form-L by the concerned authority as per OMPTS Rules, 2007. A tabulation of all the 16 stacks in question was provided in the aforesaid letter along with respective Despatch Permissions in prescribed Form L issued by the concerned authority. The Petitioner also





clarified that all stacks in question had been duly verified by the JMO, approved by the DDM, and permissions were issued following the payment of royalty, DMF & NMET.

iv. The Petitioner also highlighted that the process of stack preparation is fully governed by the provisions of the OMPTS Rules, 2007, and the corresponding Operational Guidelines, with no scope for manual intervention.

In view of the above, the Petitioner submitted that the show cause proceedings ought to be dropped. Further the Petitioner also requested to provide the SLES Report and the details with the Committee Report so as to submit a comprehensive reply followed by an effective personal hearing in the matter. Pertinently the said reply was submitted through e-mail on dated 27.11.2024 evening at 7.02 P.M.

A copy of the Petitioner's letter dated 27.11.2024 *vide* Ref. No. JSW/S/CO/2024/702 is annexed herewith as <u>Annexure-7.</u>

A copy of e-mail dated 27.11.2024 enclosing the preliminary reply submitted by Petitioner is annexed herewith as <u>Annexure-8</u>.



That, without considering the Petitioner's response to the Impugned 0. Show Cause Notice and without affording opportunity of personal hearing post submission of the preliminary reply, on the very same day i.e. 27.11.2024, the DDM/ Opposite Party issued the Demand Notice directing the Petitioner to pay Rs. 68,21,49,375/- for the cost of ore under Section 21(5) of the MMDR Act, 1957 purportedly for unauthorized dispatch of such 16 stacks of ore, Rs. 10,26,07,203/-Rs.75,24,52,823/towards royalty, towards Premium, Rs.1,02,60,721/- towards DMF, Rs. 20,52,144/- towards NMET within 7 days of issuance of the Demand Notice ("Impugned Demand Notice") by invoking the provisions of the MMDR Act, 1957 and the rules made thereunder for an alleged violation of Rule 10 of the OMPTS Rules, 2007. Pertinently, in the Impugned Demand Notice, the Opposite party No. 2 has not engaged with any of the points raised by the Petitioner in its preliminary reply, and has dismissed the same cryptically stating "not satisfactory". The Impugned Demand Notice prepared and signed on dated 27.11.2024 has been received by the Petitioner through e-mail from DDM on



dated 28.11.2024 at 1.52 P.M. It is quite shocking that when the Petitioner's preliminary reply was sent on 27.11.2024 at 7.02 pm, how the DDM issued the demand dated 27.11.2024 itself. It is quite evident that the demand is a pre-drafted order, which has been issued as part of a premeditated exercise without any consideration of the Petitioner's reply.

A copy of the Demand Notice No. VII(C)10/2023(SLES)-3664/Mines dated 27.11.2024 issued by the DDM/ Opposite Party No. 2 is annexed herewith as <u>Annexure-9</u>.

A copy of e-mail dated 28.11.2024 issued by DDM enclosing the Impugned Demand Notice is annexed herewith as <u>Annexure-10</u>.

7. That, the Petitioner states that the entire show-cause proceedings initiated from 19.11.2024 to its culmination in the Impugned Demand on 27.11.2024 has been conducted with unusual haste, without even supplying the Petitioner the reports of the SLES or the Committee, which admittedly form the foundation of the showcause proceedings. The same unequivocally demonstrates that the



whole proceeding was a pre-meditated exercise and an empty formality in complete violations of principles of natural justice.

8. That, as far as the allegations in the show-cause notice on merits are concerned, the Petitioner, without prejudice, respectfully submits that considering the stringent systems in place for ore dispatch through the i3MS system in Odisha, it is practically impossible to dispatch material without the requisite government approvals. Every tonne of ore dispatch from the subject mine is preceded by verification of stacks by designated Mining Officers, submission of samples at the Deputy Director of Chemical Analysis ("DDCA") Office for chemical analysis (in sealed/tagged bags), followed by uploading of Form K in the i3MS portal, and further application for dispatch permission through Form J via the i3MS web application. Subsequent thereto, all statutory payments, including Royalty, DMF, NMET, and User Fee, are made by the Petitioner, upon which Form L is issued by the Deputy Director of Mines. Transit passes under Form M1 are generated for each truck at the weighbridge under the supervision of a dedicated Weighbridge Clerk authorized



and deputed by the office of DDM/ Opposite party No. 2. This diligent process ensures that all iron ore dispatch activities are conducted in strict accordance with regulatory protocols and standards. The Petitioner craves leave to address all issues on merits in detail once it is provided a copy of the Reports, and given a fair and effective opportunity of responding to the allegations raised against it. The Petitioner has already paid Rs. 15 crores towards Royalty, DMF & NMET and would pay further statutory dues of approximately Rs. 50 crores towards bid premium within the statutory due date leviable against the said 16 stacks for which prior permission for removal has already been obtained from the concerned authority.

9. That, it is submitted that the Petitioner has never, during the subsistence of its mining lease, dispatched ores without the transit passes. Therefore, in view of the above, it clear that the Petitioner has fulfilled the procedure given under Rule 10 of OMPTS, Rules 2007. However, the Petitioner reserves its right to challenge the said reports in all aspects, as and when it receives such reports.



10. That, being aggrieved of the Impugned Demand Notice dated
27.11.2024 and the Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024,
the Petitioner begs to prefer the instant writ application under Article
226 & 227 of the Constitution of India, 1950 *inter alia*, on the
following amongst other:

<u>GROUNDS</u>

THE IMPUGNED SHOW-CAUSE PROCEEDINGS AS WELL AS THE DEMAND NOTICE ARE IN GROSS VIOLATIONS OF PRINCIPLES OF NATURAL JUSTICE

A. FOR THAT, the Impugned Demand Notice dated 27.11.2024 and the Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 are arbitrary and illegal since the same has been passed in flagrant violations of the principles of natural justice and complete non-application of mind, are without jurisdiction and authority of law, and in contravention of the MMDR Act, 1957 and Rules framed thereunder as well as Articles 14, 19(1)(g) and 300-A of the Constitution of India, 1950.



- **B.** FOR THAT, the Impugned Demand Notice dated 27.11.2024 and the Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 is in flagrant violation of the principles of natural justice for the following reasons:
 - a. The reports, which formed the foundation for the allegations in the show-cause notice were not shared despite repeated requests;
 - b. In the absence of the documents forming the foundation of the allegations, the allegations in the Impugned Show-Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 are wholly vague and unintelligible in nature.
 - c. The Impugned Demand Notice dated 27.11.2024 is a cryptic and unreasoned order that has been passed without any application of mind and with total disregard to the response furnished by the Petitioner to the best of its limited understanding of the vague and unintelligible allegations;



- d. The entire process has been conducted as an empty formality with a pre-meditated mindset which is evident from the prejudicial and unusually hasty manner in which the Petitioner was denied a fair and effective opportunity of being heard;
- e. The arbitrary and biased approach of the Opposite Parties is especially evident since the subject matter of the dispute is complex and technical in nature. In view of the absence of foundational documents and the unreasonably short time granted, the Petitioner's ability to present a fair and effective response, further exacerbating the irremediable prejudice caused.

<u>The non-supply of the foundational documents i.e. the SLES</u> <u>Report and the Report prepared by the Committee despite specific</u> <u>requests deprives the right of fair and effective hearing of the</u> <u>Petitioner and vitiates the instant proceedings</u>

C.

FOR THAT, the Opposite Party No. 2 has blatantly contravened the principles of natural justice by neither supplying the SLES Report & stack details nor the report prepared by the committee,



both of which formed the foundation of the Impugned Demand Notice and the Impugned Show Cause Notice. It is settled law that every person before an authority exercising adjudicatory powers has a right to know the evidence to be used against him. Pertinently, the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *Kothari Filaments* v. *Commr. of Customs*, (2009) 2 SCC 192 held the following:

"15. The Act does not prohibit application of the principles of natural justice. The Commissioner of Customs either could not have passed the order on the basis of the materials which were known only to them, copies whereof were not supplied or inspection thereto had not been given. He, thus, could not have adverted to the report of the overseas enquiries. A person charged with misdeclaration is entitled to know the ground on the basis whereof he would be penalised. He may have an answer to the charges or may not have. But there cannot be any doubt whatsoever that in law he is entitled to a proper hearing which would include supply of the documents. Only on knowing the contents of the documents, he could furnish an effective reply."

(emphasis supplied)

D. FOR THAT, the Hon'ble Supreme Court has most recently in *T*.

Takano v. SEBI, (2022) 8 SCC 162 further cemented this position

and held that:

"50. The following principles emerge from the above discussion:



for

50.1. A quasi-judicial authority has a duty to disclose the material that has been relied upon at the stage of adjudication.

50.2. An ipse dixit of the authority that it has not relied on certain material would not exempt it of its liability to disclose such material if it is relevant to and has a nexus to the action that is taken by the authority. In all reasonable probability, such material would have influenced the decision reached by the authority.

50.3. Thus, the actual test is whether the material that is required to be disclosed is relevant for purpose of adjudication. If it is, then the principles of natural justice require its due disclosure."

(emphasis supplied)

E. FOR THAT, applying the aforesaid test laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *Takano (supra)*, the SLES Report and the Committee Report in the present case are not merely relevant or tangentially connected to the allegations, rather, they form the very foundation of the proceedings initiated against the Petitioner. These documents directly inform the allegations and conclusions reached by the Opposite Parties, rendering their disclosure absolutely imperative. Moreover, there are no exceptional circumstances or legitimate reasons whatsoever for withholding these critical documents, and the failure to disclose them constitutes a gross violation of the principles of natural justice. Therefore, the right to

an effective hearing for the Petitioner has been vitiated by the nonsupply of these documents.

F. FOR THAT, it is respectfully submitted that in the absence of any access to the information contained in the SLES Report or the Report prepared by the Committee, the Petitioner cannot be reasonably expected to anticipate or guess the methodology adopted or review the veracity of the assessment undertaken by the authorities. Pertinently, the Petitioner in its preliminary response dated 27.11.2024 categorically stated that "unless the details of such coordinates and reports are not provided to us, we are unable to verify/ cross check the same from our end". The lack of transparency is further underscored by the glaring inconsistencies between the findings of these reports. While the SLES Report indicated that there is discrepancy of stacks available in the mine with that of the balance stacks showing in i3MS database purportedly derived from the system, the Committee subsequently reduced this figure to 16 stacks observing the same to be not in their designated coordinates without providing any explanation of the



methodology adopted, the data reviewed, or the rationale for this revision.

G. FOR THAT, this lack of clarity heightens the possibility of further discrepancies and/or inaccuracies, particularly when the Petitioner, in its preliminary response, provided a detailed explanation addressing the status of the 16 stacks in question. The contradictory findings between the reports are a testament to the arbitrary nature of the assessment and the urgent need to supply these documents to the Petitioner. Without access to these reports, the Petitioner is deprived of the opportunity to critically examine the veracity of the conclusions or to prepare a meaningful defense, thereby violating the principles of fairness and procedural propriety.

In the absence of the documents forming the foundation of the allegations, the allegations in the Impugned Show-Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 are vague and unintelligible in nature.

- H.
- FOR THAT, the absence of the foundational documents i.e. the SLES Report and the Report prepared by the Committee renders





the Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 vague and unintelligible, thereby depriving the Petitioner from effectively responding to the aforesaid notice.

FOR THAT, the Hon'ble Supreme Court in CCE v. Brindavan Beverages (P) Ltd., (2007) 5 SCC 388 held as follows:

> "14. There is no allegation of the respondents being parties to any arrangement. In any event, no material in that regard was placed on record. The show-cause notice is the foundation on which the Department has to build up its case. If the allegations in the showcause notice are not specific and are on the contrary vague, lack details and/or unintelligible that is sufficient to hold that the noticee was not given proper opportunity to meet the allegations indicated in the show-cause notice.....

(emphasis supplied)

In the present case, the Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 merely states that 16 stacks are not available at their designated coordinates, without clarifying whether the allegation pertains to dispatch, misplacement, or any technical deficiency. Furthermore, in the absence of foundational documents such as the SLES Report and the Committee Report, the Petitioner has no



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means to examine the methodology adopted, assess the veracity of the allegations, or determine the precise nature of the purported deficiency. The lack of disclosure and the vague framing of allegations deprive the Petitioner of a fair opportunity to respond or undertake any corrective action, if required. The undisclosed methodology forms the genesis of any response or compliance by the Petitioner, and its non-availability undermines procedural fairness and violates the principles of natural justice.

The Impugned Demand Notice dated 27.11.2024 is a cryptic and unreasoned order that has been passed without any application of mind and with total disregard to the detailed response furnished by the Petitioner.

J. FOR THAT, the issuance of a non-reasoned order, despite the Petitioner having furnished a response to the best of its limited understanding of the vague, unintelligible allegations, exposes the pre-meditated approach by the Opposite Party No. 2. It is pertinent to note that the Petitioner furnished a clarification to the so-called discrepancies in the show-cause notice in its preliminary response

dated 27.11.2024. However, in complete disregard to the aforesaid preliminary response, the DDM/ Opposite Party No. 2, on the very same day, passed the Impugned Demand Notice dated 27.11.2024 and merely recorded that the reply "*was found not satisfactory*". It is respectfully submitted that such a passive and bald observation at best qualifies as a conclusion but not the reasons leading up to the formation of such conclusion. Therefore, the Impugned Demand Notice is an unreasoned order passed without any application of mind.

K. FOR THAT, the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *Kranti Associates (P) Ltd. v. Masood Ahmed Khan*, (2010) 9 SCC 496, extensively dealt with the importance of reasoned orders and culled out the following conclusions:

"47. Summarising the above discussion, this Court holds:

(a) In India the judicial trend has always been to record reasons, even in administrative decisions, if such decisions affect anyone prejudicially.

(b) A quasi-judicial authority must record reasons in support of its conclusions.



(c) Insistence on recording of reasons is meant to serve the wider principle of justice that justice must not only be done it must also appear to be done as well.

(d) Recording of reasons also operates as a valid restraint on any possible arbitrary exercise of judicial and quasi-judicial or even administrative power.

(e) Reasons reassure that discretion has been exercised by the decision-maker on relevant grounds and by disregarding extraneous considerations.

(f) Reasons have virtually become as indispensable a component of a decision-making process as observing principles of natural justice by judicial, quasi-judicial and even by administrative bodies.

(g) Reasons facilitate the process of judicial review by superior courts.

(h) The ongoing judicial trend in all countries committed to rule of law and constitutional governance is in favour of reasoned decisions based on relevant facts. This is virtually the lifeblood of judicial decision-making justifying the principle that reason is the soul of justice.

(i) Judicial or even quasi-judicial opinions these days can be as different as the judges and authorities who deliver them. All these decisions serve one common purpose which is to demonstrate by reason that the relevant factors have been objectively considered. This is important for sustaining the litigants' faith in the justice delivery system.

(j) Insistence on reason is a requirement for both judicial accountability and transparency.

(k) If a judge or a quasi-judicial authority is not candid enough about his/her decision-making process then it is impossible to know whether the person deciding is faithful to the doctrine of precedent or to principles of incrementalism.



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(l) Reasons in support of decisions must be cogent, clear and succinct. A pretence of reasons or "rubber-stamp reasons" is not to be equated with a valid decision-making process.

(m) It cannot be doubted that transparency is the sine qua non of restraint on abuse of judicial powers. Transparency in decision-making not only makes the judges and decisionmakers less prone to errors but also makes them subject to broader scrutiny. (See David Shapiro in Defence of Judicial Candor [(1987) 100 Harvard Law Review 731-37].)

(n) Since the requirement to record reasons emanates from the broad doctrine of fairness in decision-making, the said requirement is now virtually a component of human rights and was considered part of Strasbourg Jurisprudence. See Ruiz Torija v. Spain [(1994) 19 EHRR 553] EHRR, at 562 para 29 and Anya v. University of Oxford [2001 EWCA Civ 405 (CA)], wherein the Court referred to Article 6 of the European Convention of Human Rights which requires,

"adequate and intelligent reasons must be given for judicial decisions".

(o) In all common law jurisdictions judgments play a vital role in setting up precedents for the future. Therefore, for development of law, requirement of giving reasons for the decision is of the essence and is virtually a part of "due process".

(emphasis supplied)

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FOR THAT, the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh at Hyderabad in *K. Ashok Kumar v. Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation*, 2012 SCC OnLine AP 383 specifically dealt with





the usage of phrase "found not satisfactory" in quasi-judicial orders

and observed the following:

"Whereas the relevant portion of the impugned order reads as under:

"the reply submitted by you vide reference 3^{rd} cited in response to the show-cause notice has been examined and the same is not found satisfactory."

To say the least this is most unsatisfactory way of deciding an issue. Every order must contain the reasons for the conclusion arrived thereat. It is the reasons which provide the links to the conclusions. The relevance of those reasons must lend support to the conclusion. The expressions "found not satisfactory" are reflective of the conclusion but, not the reason. As to why the explanation offered by the petitioners is not satisfactory, forms part of their process of reasoning."

(emphasis supplied)

It is pertinent to note that the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh at Hyderabad has consistently followed this jurisprudence, as would be evident from *Sala Venkanna v. State of A.P.*, 2023 SCC OnLine AP 758 and *Jarripothula Veera Venkata Satyanarayana v. State of A.P.*, 2023 SCC OnLine AP 3607. It is respectfully submitted that the aforesaid approach is in alignment with the principles of fairness and transparency and ought to be



adopted in the instant case. Therefore, the instant Impugned Demand Notice dated 27.11.2024 being without any reasons ought to be quashed since it is an unreasoned order passed without any application of mind.

<u>The entire process has been conducted as an empty formality with</u> <u>a pre-meditated mindset which is evident from the pre-judicial</u> <u>and hasty manner in which the Petitioner was denied a fair and</u> <u>effective opportunity of being heard;</u>

M. FOR THAT, it is submitted that the undue haste with which the proceedings were conducted render the entire proceedings as an empty formality and reflect the pre-meditated mindset of the Opposite Parties. This can be evidenced by, for instance, the scheduling of the personal hearing in less than three days (i.e. on 22.11.2024 at 11:30am) from the issuance of the show cause notice (i.e. on 19.11.2024). This can be similarly observed by the Opposite Party No. 2 merely granting an extension by 1 day for the submission of reply *vide* its letter dated 25.11.2024.



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N. FOR THAT, it is pertinent to note that the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Oryx Fisheries (P) Ltd. v. Union of India, (2010) 13 SCC 427 has held that:

"31. It is of course true that the show-cause notice cannot be read hypertechnically and it is well settled that it is to be read reasonably. But one thing is clear that while reading a show-cause notice the person who is subject to it must get an impression that he will get an effective opportunity to rebut the allegations contained in the show-cause notice and prove his innocence. If on a reasonable reading of a show-cause notice a person of ordinary prudence gets the feeling that his reply to the show-cause notice will be an empty ceremony and he will merely knock his head against the impenetrable wall of prejudged opinion, such a show-cause notice does not commence a fair procedure especially when it is issued in a quasijudicial proceeding under a statutory regulation which promises to give the person proceeded against a reasonable opportunity of defence."

(emphasis supplied)

FOR THAT, the Hon'ble Supreme Court has adopted a proactive approach in dealing with proceedings initiated with a pre-meditated mindset wherein it has taken a step further to assert that in such cases, even a hearing of the matter afresh would not yield any



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fruitful purpose. The Hon'ble Supreme Court in *Siemens Ltd. v. State of Maharashtra*, (2006) 12 SCC 33 specifically observed the following:

> "9. Although ordinarily a writ court may not exercise its discretionary jurisdiction in entertaining a writ petition questioning a notice to show cause unless the same inter alia appears to have been without jurisdiction as has been held by this Court in some decisions including State of U.P. v. Brahm Datt Sharma [(1987) 2 SCC 179 : (1987) 3 ATC 319 : AIR 1987 SC 943], Special Director v. Mohd. Ghulam Ghouse [(2004) 3 SCC 440 : 2004 SCC (Cri) 826] and Union India v. Kunisetty of Satyanarayana [(2006) 12 SCC 28 : (2006) 12 Scale 262], but the question herein has to be considered from a different angle viz. when a notice is issued with premeditation, a writ petition would be maintainable. In such an event, even if the court directs the statutory authority to hear the matter afresh, ordinarily such hearing would not yield any fruitful purpose. (See K.I. Shephard v. Union of India [(1987) 4 SCC 431 : 1987 SCC (L&S) 438 : AIR 1988 SC 686] .) It is evident in the instant case that the respondent has clearly made



up its mind. It explicitly said so both in the counteraffidavit as also in its purported show-cause notice." (emphasis supplied)

P. FOR THAT, the Opposite Party No. 2 has egregiously failed to effectively comply with the obligation to grant an opportunity of hearing to the Petitioner by providing *less than three days* in scheduling the briefing to respond to the show cause notice. Therefore, the Opposite Party No. 2's hasty, premature and arbitrary actions in failing to grant an effective opportunity to the Petitioner to respond consequently amounts to conducting the proceedings as an *empty formality* with a pre-meditated mindset and hence, the Impugned Demand Notice merits to be quashed on this ground alone.



<u>The arbitrary and biased approach of the Opposite Parties is</u> <u>especially prejudicial since the subject matter of the dispute is</u> <u>complex and technical in nature</u>.



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- FOR THAT, the arbitrary and biased conduct of the Opposite Q. Parties is especially prejudicial given the inherently complex and technical nature of the subject matter in dispute. The Petitioner's ability to present a fair and effective response was irreparably hindered by the Opposite Parties' refusal to furnish foundational documents essential for understanding the allegations. Despite the Petitioner, in its preliminary response dated 27.11.2024, explicitly stating that "unless the details of such coordinates and reports are not provided to us, we are unable to verify/cross-check the same from our end" no meaningful opportunity to respond on merits was afforded. The lack of clarity, compounded by the unreasonably short time granted, exacerbated the prejudice caused, violating the principles of fairness and natural justice.
- R. FOR THAT, the actions of the Opposite Parties reflect a disregard for procedural propriety, particularly in light of the Petitioner's efforts to engage meaningfully despite the constraints imposed. Despite the lack of access to the foundational documents, the Petitioner, in its preliminary response, provided a detailed



explanation addressing the status of the 16 stacks in question. However, this was only a preliminary response, and the Petitioner had clearly communicated its inability to respond comprehensively without access to the foundational documents. By denying access to such documents and failing to provide a reasonable timeframe, the Opposite Parties effectively precluded the Petitioner from offering a substantive response or verifying the accuracy of the allegations. Such actions highlight an arbitrary and biased approach that undermines the fairness of the adjudicatory process.

THE IMPUGNED DEMAND IS BASED WHOLLY ON SURMISES AND CONJECTURES

FOR THAT, the Impugned Demand Notice is perverse and based on surmises and conjectures in as much as it employs the phrase *"indicates"* to draw a co-relation between alleged unavailability and dispatch without an iota of evidence to substantiate such allegations of dispatch. It is submitted that the mere allegation of unavailability and legitimate application for permission cannot justify an inference of clandestine (allegedly illegal) removal of



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ores (as sought to be done in the present case). In order to attribute an act of clandestine removal upon the leaseholder either there must be a clear admission to this effect on the part of leaseholder or it must be corroborated by further credible evidence that there is clandestine removal. In the present case, there is no credible evidence on the part of the Opposite party No. 2 to come to a conclusion that the Petitioner has dispatched the ores. In this context, it is pertinent to note that the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *Oudh Sugar Mills Ltd. v. Union of India, (1978) 2 ELT (J172)* held that no show cause notice or an order can be based on assumptions and presumptions and further noted that such findings based on such assumptions and presumptions without any tangible evidence will be vitiated by an error of law.

T. FOR THAT, the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of Lalchand Bhagat Ambica Ram v. Commissioner of Income Tax, Bihar and Orissa reported in (1959) 37 ITR 288 has held that orders of assessment should not be made based on suspicion, conjectures or surmises nor without any evidence and if the said assessment



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suffers from the aforesaid infirmities, then the same ought to be set aside. The aforesaid principle of law has also been laid down in the case of *Commissioner of Income Tax, Bihar and Orissa, Patna v. S.P. Jain* reported in (1973) 3 SCC 824.

U. FOR THAT, it is incumbent upon administrative authorities to issue a speaking and reasoned order, a principle firmly embedded in our legal framework. However, the Impugned Demand Notice conspicuously lacks any rationale or explanation for the rejection of the Petitioner's defense stated in its show cause reply.

THE IMPUGNED DEMAND NOTICE IS WITHOUT JURISDICTION AND AUTHORITY OF LAW

V. FOR THAT, Section 23C of the MMDR Act, 1957 empowers the State Government to make rules for prevention of (i) illegal mining, (ii) illegal transportation and (iii) illegal storage of minerals. The State, in exercise of its powers conferred under Section 23C(1), has framed the OMPTS Rules, 2007. Pertinently, even though the impugned order refers to violation of Rule 10 of the OMPTS Rules,



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2007, no penalty has been imposed under the said Rules. Rather, the Impugned Demand seeks to recover the cost of ore, royalty, DMF charges, NMET charges and auction premium which is relatable to Section 21(5), 9(1), 9B (5), 9C(4) of the MMDR Act, 1957 and Rule 13(2) of the Mineral Auction Rules, 2015 respectively for alleged unauthorized dispatch of ore from the said 16 stacks, despite the Petitioner duly providing details of the same.

W. FOR THAT, Rule 10(5) read can have application only in cases where there has been dispatch of minerals without any transit permit. The DDM/ Opposite party No. 2 had no jurisdiction to issue the Impugned Demand Notice, inasmuch as there is no evidence or finding that even a single ton of iron ore area left the leasehold area without a transit permit thereby resulting in non-compliance of Rule 10(5). Rather, the Impugned Demand Notice has been issued on a mere presumption that it has dispatched the ores without any prior transit permit.



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WITHOUT PREJUDICE TO THE CONTENTION ON VIOLATION OF NATURAL JUSTICE, THE PETITIONER ASSERTS THAT THERE IS NO UNAUTHORIZED DESPATCH OF ANY ORE BY THE PETITIONER

- X. FOR THAT, wholly without prejudice to the Petitioner's contention that it was never given any effective opportunity of replying to the Show-Cause Notice, the Petitioner submits that it dealt the issue of 16 stacks in question along with the erstwhile updated status of such stacks in para 3 of the preliminary response dated 27.11.2024. However, the Impugned Demand Notice has been passed without any consideration to the response furnished and total non-application of mind.
- Y. FOR THAT, the allegation of unauthorized dispatch is wholly baseless and preposterous as the Opposite party No. 2 had itself granted permission for the dispatch of the said stacks after conducting a proper inspection and verification of the materials through scientific methods. Out of the 16 stacks in question, 13 stacks despatched as of now were duly dispatched in compliance



with all statutory requirements, including the payment of statutory dues, weighment of the materials, and issuance of transit passes. Even 3 stacks out of the 16 stacks, the permission of which were earlier obtained and subsequently lapsed are still lying in the lease area being undespatched. The grant of permission by the competent authority inherently signifies that the materials met the requisite legal and procedural standards. Hence, the allegation of unauthorized dispatch is patently unfounded and devoid of merit.

- Z. FOR THAT, the allegations concerning the despatch of 5 stacks after issuance of show cause notice are equally untenable and lack any factual or legal basis. It is submitted that permits for the dispatch of these 5 stacks were duly issued, which establishes that the dispatches were conducted with proper authorization and that the permits remain valid and intact. This further reinforces that there has been no violation of the statutory or procedural requirements.
- AA. FOR THAT, it is stated that every dispatch from the mine is conducted with rigorous adherence to OMPTS Rules, 2007, and is

preceded by obtaining Permissions under Form-L and, Transit Permits/Railway Receipts from the relevant authorities. It is submitted that statutory returns such as monthly and annual returns of the Petitioner were accepted by the competent authorities without any objections or demur and at no point of time, there has been any detection by the competent authority of ores being removed from the subject mines without transit permit as provided under the OMPTS Rules, 2007.

- **BB.** FOR THAT, it is submitted that the Opposite Parties have appointed their own officer at the Petitioner's mine to monitor the production, stack, grade, quantity and ensure the correct weighment, payment of statutory dues and premium.
- **CC.** FOR THAT, the i3MS system is an ERP software which tracks every ton of dispatch from the subject mine to the final destination and includes issuance of transit passes, GPS tracking of transporting vehicles amongst others and is designed as per process approved under OMPTS Rules, 2007. The Petitioner has consistently complied with all applicable acts and rules and

therefore, the Impugned Demand Notice and Impugned Show Cause Notice are unfounded.

- DD. FOR THAT, the i3MS system provides a robust mechanism to govern possession, storage, trading and transportation of iron ore in the state of Odisha to prevent theft, smuggling and illegal mining. It is submitted that ores cannot be transported outside the subject mine without issuance of proper challans for transportation.
- EE. FOR THAT, as per Section 9(2) of the MMDR Act, 1957, the holder of the mining lease shall pay royalty in respect of any mineral removed or consumed from the leased area. Further, it is stated that as per Rule 13 of Mineral (Auction) Rules, 2015, the lessee shall pay the royalty as specified under the MMDR Act, 1957 and Rules made thereunder. It is submitted that the Petitioner has always paid the royalty and other mining levies before the iron ore minerals are dispatched from the leased area. It is further submitted that the Opposite Parties have failed to consider the statutory payment such as Royalty, DMF & NMET before despatch and payment of premium after despatch made by the Petitioner.



Hence, the question of non-payment of royalty and other statutory dues does not arise.

FF. FOR THAT, it is respectfully submitted that considering the stringent systems in place for ore dispatch through the i3MS system in Odisha, it is practically impossible to dispatch material without the requisite government approvals. Every tonne of ore dispatch from the subject mine is preceded by verification of stacks by designated AMO/JMO, submission of samples at the Deputy Director of Chemical Analysis ("DDCA") Office for chemical analysis (in sealed/tagged bags), followed by uploading of Form K in the i3MS portal, and further application for dispatch permission through Form J via the i3MS web application. Subsequent thereto, all statutory payments, including Royalty, DMF, NMET, and User Fee, are made by the Petitioner, upon which Form L is issued by the Deputy Director of Mines. Transit passes under Form M1 are generated for each truck at the weighbridge and/or Railway Receipt under the supervision of a dedicated Weighbridge Clerk authorized and deputed by the office of DDM/ Opposite party No. 2. This

diligent process ensures that all iron ore dispatch activities are conducted in strict accordance with regulatory protocols and standards. It is submitted that the Petitioner has never, during the subsistence of its mining lease, dispatched ores without the transit passes. Therefore, in view of the above, it clear that the Petitioner has fulfilled the procedure given under Rule 10 of OMPTS, Rules 2007.

GG. FOR THAT, as per Rule 13 of Minerals (Other than Atomic and Hydro Carbons Energy Minerals) Concession Rules, 2016 and Rule 11 of Mineral Conservation & Development Rules, 2017, the holder of mining lease shall carry out the mining operations in accordance with the mining plan. It is submitted that all mining operations carried out at the subject mine strictly adheres to the mining plan as approved by IBM.

HH. FOR THAT, the Impugned show-cause proceedings and demand are otherwise bad in law.

11. That, it is pertinent to note that in similar cases, other mining leaseholders have approached the Hon'ble Revisional Authority, Ministry of Mines, Government of India under Section 30 of the MMDR Act, 1957, wherein the aforesaid authority has taken the view that such revision applications which relate to issues arising out of the OMPTS Rules, 2007 are not maintainable before it, and thus refused to exercise jurisdiction as there is a bar under Section 23(C)(3) of MMDR Act, 1957. Therefore, the Petitioner submits that it has no efficacious or speedy alternative remedy other than approaching this Hon'ble Court invoking extra ordinary jurisdiction in the interest of justice.

Copies of the orders passed by the Hon'ble Revisionary Authority in Revision Application 22/02/2024-RC-1 (order dated 30.10.2024), Revision Application 22/30/2023-RC-1 (order dated 05.08.2024) and Revision Application 22/25/2023-RC-1 (order dated 06.05.2024) are annexed herewith as <u>Annexure-11 Series</u>.

12. That, in any case, in view of the blatant violations of the principles of natural justice in the instant proceedings, the availability of



alternate remedy is not a bar to approach this Hon'ble Court in view of law settled by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India since in *State of U.P. v. Mohd. Nooh*, 1957 SCC OnLine SC 2 and the consistent position of law since then. The position on this point may be evinced from the Hon'ble Supreme Court's observations in *Whirlpool Corpn. v. Registrar of Trade Marks*, (1998) 8 SCC 1:

> "15. Under Article 226 of the Constitution, the High Court, having regard to the facts of the case, has a discretion to entertain or not to entertain a writ petition. But the High Court has imposed upon itself certain restrictions one of which is that if an effective and efficacious remedy is available, the High Court would not normally exercise its jurisdiction. But the alternative remedy has been consistently held by this Court not to operate as a bar in at least three contingencies, namely, where the writ petition has been filed for the enforcement of any of the Fundamental Rights or where there has been a violation of the principle of natural justice or where the order or proceedings are wholly without jurisdiction or the vires of an Act is challenged. There is a plethora of case-law on this point but to cut down this circle of forensic whirlpool, we would rely on some



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old decisions of the evolutionary era of the constitutional law as they still hold the field."

(emphasis supplied)

The aforesaid position has been most recently affirmed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *Ernakulam Regional Coop. Milk Producers Union Ltd. v. Nithu*, 2024 SCC OnLine SC 650. In the instant case, as elaborated in detail above, the arbitrary and premeditated actions of Opposite Party No. 2, including the failure to provide foundational documents and the lack of transparency, have resulted in grave violations of the principles of natural justice. Moreover, these actions have also infringed upon the fundamental rights of the Petitioner under Articles 14 and 19(1)(g) of the Constitution, necessitating judicial intervention. Accordingly, the Petitioner submits that this Hon'ble Court has jurisdiction to entertain the present writ petition and that the availability of alternate remedies, if any does not preclude the exercise of such jurisdiction.

- 13. That the Petitioner further craves leave to challenge the SLES Report as well as the Report prepared by the Committee constituted by Opposite Party No. 2 if and when such reports are shared by the Petitioner on the basis of their competence, methodology, and other grounds available under law.
- 14. That this Writ Petition is made *bonafide* in the interest of justice.

PRAYER

In the circumstances it is, therefore, prayed that Your Lordships be graciously pleased to issue Rule Nisi calling upon the Opposite Parties to show cause as to why the show cause notice *vide* File No. 10/2023-SLES3601/Mines dated 19.11.2024 issued by the Deputy Director of Mines, Joda vide Annexure-4 and consequential Demand Notice No. VII(C)10/2023(SLES)-3664/Mines dated 27.11.2024 issued by the Deputy Director of Mines, Joda vide Annexure-9 should not be quashed and if the Opposite Parties fail to show cause or show insufficient cause, make the Rule absolute;

AND



Pass any other consequential Order/Orders, Writ/Writs, direction/ directions as deem fit and proper.

And for which act of kindness the Petitioner shall as in duty bound ever pray.

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
- (iii) pay such compensation as may be assessed by lawful authority in accordance with the law in force on the subject for all damage, injury, or disturbance which may be done by the Lessee in exercise of the powers granted by this Lease and to indemnified fully and completely the State Government against all claims which may be by any person or persons in respect of any such damage, injury or disturbance and all costs and expenses in connection therewith;

At the outset we would like to submit that vide our letter dated 22.11.2024 under reference (ii), we have requested your good office to provide the report of the committee as well as the Joint inspection report of SLES and the details of the stacks. Further, we also requested to grant at least two weeks' time after providing the reports and details so as to examine/verify/crosscheck the same with our records, field and revert, as most of the stacks referred in the SCN are year old.

However, only one day extension has been allowed and no reports or details have been provided to us. In this scenario, there is an effective denial of principle of natural justice preventing us to submit a comprehensive reply to the SCN and thereafter attend personal hearing. Having said that, in compliance with your letter under reference (iii), we without prejudice, submit this reply as a preliminary response to the observations mentioned in the SCN.

1. That, on 19.11.2024, we were in receipt of the SCN wherein we have been asked to show cause regarding non-availability of 16 nos. of stacks in their designated coordinates in our Jajang Mine. This notice addresses the circumstances surrounding an ex-parte observation made by the SLES team during their visit to our Jajang mines on 03.07.2024 to 04.07.2024. Neither the report of the SLES nor details in respect of basis of its observations were provided despite repeated requests.

From the above table it can be seen that 11 nos of stacks out of the 16 stacks are old stacks and were lying in the lease area for more than a year the permission for removal in respect of which either being lapsed and/or being re-permitted multiple times. Further, it is evident from the above table that most of the stacks have been dispatched/under dispatch after obtaining due permission/re-permission from your good office under Form-L. 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- It is pertinent to mention the process of preparation of stacks prescribed under OMPTS Rule, 2007 (amended in 2021) read with the Operational Guideline notified by the Steel and Mines Department.
 - a. After mineral is extracted and desired to be removed from the leasehold area, the mineral needs to be stacked in geometric shape of trapezoid with a height of not more than 3 meters and weight of not more than 20,000 metric tonnes. The entire process of preparation of stacks till dispatch are regulated through I3MS portal and there is no manual intervention in the process.
 - b. After preparation of a stacks the lessee has to log in to the web/mobile app using the existing I3MS lessee code and password, and then select the option to submit a request for sampling. The details pertaining to the dimensions of the stacks and their geo-coordinates are submitted online in Form S Part I after which the JMO visits the mines to verify the stack.
 - c. On submission of Form-S, Part-1 in i3MS, the assigned JMO reaches the mine site and activates the inspection process for a stack. <u>The inspection is only</u> <u>activated once the mobile app detects the presence of JMO within the geofence of the stack i.e. pre-determined proximity of the stack.</u> (*Refer: point no 7 (c)(iii) of the Operational Guideline*).

The mobile app will prompt the holder of the mobile set to proceed to any corner of the stack to map the points of generation for any side of the stack. Accordingly, the starting and end of the side will be marked." That after both the endpoints of the sides are captured, then only the mobile will generate the sample points for points for the process of sectioning. (*Refer: Point no.* 7 (c) (vi) (1) of the Operational Guideline).

6. Thus, it is clear that unless a stack is well within the co-ordinates as stated in Form S Part I, the JMO may not be able to proceed further with the aforesaid assignment of verification and sampling. The aforesaid stacks are duly verified by the JMO assigned by your good office and after deposit of Royalty, DMF & NMET permission for dispatch under Form L have been issued by your good office and subsequently either dispatched or lying in the field. Therefore, allegation of mismatch of co-ordinates of the subject stacks as referred in SCN are unfounded and not acceptable and requires to be reconsidered at your end. It is humbly submitted that a person subjected to allegation ought not to be deprived of having access to the basis of such allegation and the action of your good offices ought not amount to pre-determined and prejudicial exercise as

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the same would be in violation of principles of natural justice and thus arbitrary. Further an opportunity for hearing has to be effective and not an empty formality.

7. Pertinently, all the stacks have been duly verified, royalty paid and re-permitted which were existing in the mines for a considerable period. Further, the alleged inspection and reporting of Committee regarding unavailability of 16 stacks in their designated coordinates have not been confronted to us in the field to cross check such allegation.

From the above, it is amply clear that there is no violation of lease condition or irregularities committed by us. Hence, the instant SCN is liable to be dropped. Further, this reply is submitted as a preliminary response without prejudice to our right and contentions and subject to submission of comprehensive reply on being provided with the report of the Committee, Stack details & the SLES report. We expect your good office shall provide us copies of the reports and details sought by us and effective opportunity for a personal hearing post submission of comprehensive reply in the interest of justice.



Whereas the MDPA of Jajang Iron Ore Block was signed and executed andregistered on dt. 25.06.2020 for a period of 50 years and the mining operation is carried out with all statutory clearances.

<u>ORDER</u>

[Under Section 30 of the Mines & Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 (MMDR Act) and Rule 36 of Minerals (other than atomic and Hydro Carbons Energy Minerals) Concession Rules, 2016].

The Revision Application was taken up for hearing on 18.10.2024. The Revisionist was represented by Shri Naveen Kumar, Advocate and by Shri Nitesh Bhandari, Advocate. State Government was represented by Shri Arunav Patnaik, Advocate, Shri Nirbhay Nitya Nanda, Advocate and by Shri Bharat Chandra Nayak, Under Secretary to Government of Odisha, Steel & Mines Department.

- Heard the Ld. Counsel for the Revisionist and the Ld. Counsel for the State Government. The Revisionist has challenged the demand notice dated - 14.12.2023 asking the revisionist to pay the differential Royalty, DMF & NMET of Rs. 48,11,67,605/-, Rs. 11,72,19,616/- & Rs. 78,59,084/- respectively for the period from 31.03.2012 to 30.11.2023.
- 2. The Ld. Counsel for the Revisionist states that State Government has given demand notice for realisation of differential royalty with respect to mineral limestone at the highest rate of Rs. 90/- per tonne under the second schedule of MMDR Act, 1957. The Revisionist produces limestone for manufacturing cement and has been paying applicable

royalty for cement grade limestone whereas the highest rate of royalty for limestone is for L.D. grade which is not used in cement production. He states that under the Orissa Minerals (Presentation of Theft, Smuggling and Illegal Mining and Regulation of Possession, Storage, Trading & Transportation) Rules, 2007 the Revisionist has agreed to pay highest rate of royalty for the same grade of limestone not for the different grade of limestone.

- 3. The Ld. Counsel for the State Government states that this is a case under Rule 10(7) of Orissa Minerals (PTSIMRPST&T) Rules, 2007 and Revisionary Authority in earlier three cases i.e., R.A. No. 22/23/2023 RC-I M/s. Jindal Steel & Power Ltd. versus State Government of Odisha, R.A. No. 22/25/2023 RC-I M/s. Steel Authority of India Limited versus State Government of Odisha and R.A. No. 22/30/2023 RC-I M/s. Narbheram Power & Steel (P) Ltd. versus State Government of Odisha has held that it has no power to proceed in cases relating to rules made under Section 23C by the State Government.
- 4. In view of the above, since the undersigned has already taken a stand that Revisionary Authority does not have any jurisdiction cases pertaining to rules made under Section 23C of MMDR Act, 1957 by the State Governments, the proceeding is hereby dropped.

[Under Section 30 of the Mines & Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 (MMDR Act) and Rule 36 of Minerals (other than atomic and Hydro Carbons Energy Minerals) Concession Rules, 2016].

The Revision Application was taken up for hearing on 23.07.2024. The Revisionist was represented by Shi Ashok Kumar Parija, Senior Advocate, Shri Naveen Kumar, Advocate, Shri Nitesh Bhandari, Advocate, Ms. Stuti Bisht, Advocate, Shri Avnish Sharma, Advocate, Shri Navneet Dogra, Advocate, Ms. K. Tanushri Rao, Advocate and by Shri Vivek Ojha, Advocate. State Government was represented by Shri Soumyajit Pani, Advocate, Shri Aishwary Bajpai, Advocate and by Shri Bharat Chandra Nayak, Under Secretary to Government of Odisha, Steel & Mines Department.

- Heard the Ld. Counsel for the Revisionist and the Ld. Counsel for the State Government. The Revisionist has filed Revision Petition against demand notice dated - 12.10.2023 by which the State Government has asked the Revisionist to pay Rs. 15,91,94,060/- for dispatch of 9966.99 MT of iron ore CLO without lawful authority as per section 21 (5) of MMDR Act, 1957 and for violation of Rule 10(5) of OMPTS Rule, 2007.
- In the instant case, the State Government inspected the mine and found shortage of 9966.99 MT of CLO in the books of account which the State Government assumed to have been dispatched without taking prior

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permission from the competent authority violating the provisions of Rule 10 of Orissa Minerals (PTSIMRPST&T) Rules, 2007 made under section 23C and section 9(2) of the MMDR Act, 1957, Rule 13(1) of Mineral (Auction) Rules, 2015 & Rule 12 of MC Rules, 2016.

- 3. Since the cause of action has arisen because of inspection carried out by the State Government under Orissa Minerals (PTSIMRPST&T) Rules, 2007 where it found shortage in quantity of mineral, the undersigned heard the Ld. Counsel for the Revisionist and the Ld. Counsel for the State Government as to whether the Revisionary Authority has power to decide such matters.
- 4. The Ld. Counsel for the Revisionist states that this is a matter of payment of royalty and other dues including auction premium under section 9 & 10B of MMDR Act and not a case under the section 23C. He further states that if Revisionist, as alleged by the State Government, has violated Rule 10(5) of Orissa Minerals (PTSIMRPST&T) Rules, 2007, but since there is no penal provision for violation of Rule 10(5) of Orissa Minerals (PTSIMRPST&T) Rules, 2007 and the State Government is not authorized to demand compensation under section 21(5) for violation of Rule 10(5). He further states that even if it is considered as violation of Rule 10(5), the penalty provided in Rule 18 of Orissa Minerals (PTSIMRPST&T) Rules, 2007 is not realization of the value of mineral. He states that there is no provision of appeal against such order under Rule 10(5) of Orissa Minerals (PTSIMRPST&T) Rules, 2007. The Ld. Counsel for the Revisionist gives the reference of judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court in C.A. Nos. 10373-10374 of 2010 (State of Gujarat and Others Etc. vs. Jayeshbhai Kanjibhai Kalathiya Etc.) and states that illegal mining cannot take place within the lease area.

- 5. In this regard, after going through the Revision Petition and the arguments of the Ld. Counsel for the State Government the following examination is done.
- 6. Section 23C (3) states "Notwithstanding anything contained in section 30, the Central Government shall have no power to revise any order passed by a State Government or any of its authorized officers or any authority under the rules made under sub-sections (1) and (2)". Hence, Revisionary Authority under Central Government does not have power to revise any order passed by State Government or any of its authorized officers in cases of alleged violation of rules made under section 23C (1). In this case, the State Government has brought out violation of such rules.
- 7- As regards, the contention of the Ld. Counsel for the State Government that illegal mining cannot take place within the leased area, attention is drawn to explanation of Section 21 which states "Explanation : On and from the date of commencement of the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Amendment Act, 2021, the expression "raising, transporting or causing to raise or transport any mineral without any lawful authority" occurring in this section, shall mean raising, transporting or causing to raise or transport any mineral by a person without prospecting licence, mining lease or composite licence [exploration licence] or in contravention of the rules made under section 23C". It clearly includes contravention of rules made under section 23C as illegal mining.
- 8. Attention is also drawn to definition of illegal mining in MCR, 1960 which states that "illegal mining" means any reconnaissance or prospecting or mining operation undertaken by any person or a company in any area without holding a reconnaissance permit or a prospecting licence or as the case may be, a mining lease as required under subsection (1) of section 4 of the Act.

Explanation: For the purpose of this clause, ---

(a) violation of any rules, other than the rules made under section 23C of the Act, within the mining lease area by a holder of a mining lease shall not include illegal mining;"

(b) any area granted under a reconnaissance permit or a prospecting licence or a mining lease, as the case may be, shall be considered as an area held with lawful authority by the holder of such permit of licence or a lease, while determining the extension of illegal mining".

Here also violation of rules made under section 23C amounts to illegal mining.

- 9. Since the Central Government does not have power to revise any order passed by the State Government or any of its authorized officers, as per rules made under section 23C, in my considered opinion, the undersigned does not have the power to look into the provisions of Orissa Minerals (PTSIMRPST&T) Rules, 2007 to decide on legality of the action taken by the State Government for violation of individual rules of Orissa Minerals (PTSIMRPST&T) Rules, 2007.
- 10. The consequences of illegal mining or mining without lawful authority are given in section 21, especially sub-section (5). The State Government is empowered to make rules for preventing illegal mining, transportation and storage of minerals. Therefore, if any case of illegal mining is detected as per rules made under section 23C the consequences will follow under section 21 (5). The Revisionary Authority cannot interfere in such cases of violation of rules made under section 23C just because the consequences fall under 21 (5). If an interpretation is taken that the Revisionary Authority under section 30 can interfere in such matters, the express ban applied under section 23C (3) will become meaningless and will render the whole structure of checking and monitoring illegal mining, transportation and storage being exclusively under the State

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Government meaningless. This has the potential of affecting day to day administration of mines under a single authority adversely.

11. In view of the above, the undersigned is not competent to hear the matter. Hence, the proceeding is here by dropped. The Revisionist is at liberty to approach appropriate authority as per the Rules made under section 23C (1).

<u>ORDER</u>

[Under Section 30 of the Mines & Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 (MMDR Act) and Rule 36 of Minerals (other than atomic and Hydro Carbons Energy Minerals) Concession Rules, 2016].

The Revision Application was taken up for hearing on 18.04.2024. The Revisionist was represented by Ms. Pinky Anand, Senior Advocate, Shri Priyesh Srivastava, Advocate, Ms. Asees Kaur Jasmine, Advocate and by Shri Sanjeev Kumar, Sr. Manager (Law) SAIL. State Government was represented by Shri Soumyajit Pani, Advocate, Shri Aishwary Bajpai, Advocate, and by Shri Bharat Chandra Nayak, Under Secretary to Government of Odisha, Steel & Mines Department.

 Heard the Ld. Counsel for the Revisionist and the Ld. Counsel for the State Government. The Revisionist has challenged the demand order dated - 25.01.2023 imposing a demand of Rs. 13,37,49,485/- for shortage of quantity of limestone in dumping. There has been further correspondence between the State Government and the Revisionist. The State Government vide its letter dated - 03.03.2023 informed that "the reply and reason for shortage of mineral due to annual disintegration and

exposed to natural vagaries explained vide your letter under reference is not acceptable as the shortage quantity is huge i.e., 1,82,760.32 MT.

Section 21 (5) of MMDR Act, 1957 clearly states that "Whenever any person raises, without any lawful authority, any minerals from any land, the State Govt. may recover from such person the mineral so raised, or where such mineral has already been disposed of, the price thereof, and may also recover from such person, rent, royalty or tax, as the case may be, for the period during which the land was occupied such person without any lawful authority".

Further, rule 10 of Orissa Minerals (PTSIMRPST&T) Rules, 2007 states that "Any person wishes to transport or remove any mineral from any place, shall make an application complete in all respect in Form-H to the competent Authority for issue of permit".

In the instant case the lessee has not obtained any permission to lift the above said quantity which is huge one and reply submitted by you vide letter No. RSP/RL&DQ/2023/92 dated - 25.02.2023 is not satisfactory and acceptable.

Therefore, you are requested to deposit the demanded dues of Rs. 13,37,49,485/- only raised vide this office letter No. 167/Mines, Dated 25.01.2023".

2. As per section 23C of the MMDR Act, the State Government has the power to make rules for preventing illegal mining, transportation and storage of minerals. The Orissa Minerals (PTSIMRPST&T) Rules, 2007 have been prepared by the by State Government in exercise of the power conferred by section 23C of the MMDR Act 1957. The Section 23C (3) states that "Notwithstanding anything contained in section 30, the Central Government shall have no power to revise any order passed by a State Government or any of its authorized officers or any authority under the rules made under sub-sections (1) and (2)". Hence, the Revisionary

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
Authority empowered under section 30 of the MMDR Act has no power to amend any order passed by the State Government under the rules made under section 23C.

Most Respectfully Sheweth :-

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- That, by means of the accompanying Writ Petition, the Petitioner has been constrained to approach this Hon'ble Court invoking its extra-ordinary jurisdiction vested under Articles 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India, 1950 challenging the Show-Cause Notice No. 10/2023-SLES/3601/Mines dated 19.11.2024 ("Impugned Show Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024") and consequential Demand vide Notice No. VII (C) 10/2023(SLES)-3664/Mines dated 27.11.2024 ("Impugned Demand Notice dated 27.11.2024") issued by the Deputy Director of Mines, Joda Circle, Keonjhar for being issued in complete and brazen violation of the very principles of natural justice, as well as being bad in law, arbitrary, unreasonable, and hit by Articles 14, 19(1)(g) and 300-A of the Constitution of India, 1950.
- 2. That the averments made in the accompanying writ petition may be read as a part and parcel of the present interim application.
- 3. That it is submitted that the Impugned Demand Notice and the Impugned Show Cause Notice are in flagrant violation of the principles of natural justice as the said notices have been based upon SLES Report and the Committee Report which were not



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shared with the Petitioner despite repeated requests. Thus, the Petitioner was deprived of its right to a fair and effective hearing. Further, in the absence of the documents forming the foundation of the allegations, the allegations in the Impugned Show-Cause Notice dated 19.11.2024 are vague and unintelligible in nature.

- 4. That, it is further submitted that the Impugned Demand Notice dated 27.11.2024 is a cryptic and unreasoned order that has been passed without any application of mind and with total disregard to the response furnished by the Petitioner.
- 5. That apart, it is submitted that the entire process has been conducted as an empty formality with a pre-meditated mindset which is evident from the prejudicial and unusually hasty manner in which the Petitioner was denied a fair and effective opportunity of being heard. Such arbitrary and biased approach of the Opposite Parties is especially evident since the subject matter of the dispute is complex and technical in nature. In view of the absence of foundational documents and the unreasonably short time granted, the Petitioner's ability to present a fair and effective response, further exacerbated the prejudice caused.



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- 6. That, the Petitioner apprehends that the Opposite Parties may block its access to i3MS portal if it does not pay the Impugned Demand which has been levied arbitrarily, illegally, unlawfully, unreasonably, without application of mind and in blatant violation of principles of natural justice. In the event that the Opposite Parties block Petitioner's access to i3MS portal, the Petitioner shall be effectively prevented from carrying any mining operations, including sampling and dispatch of minerals and would thus be unable to exposed to further penalties apart from grave financial loss and market reputation.
- 7. That, on the facts and in the circumstances of the case, the Petitioner submits that it would be just and proper and in the interest of justice to grant interim relief during the pendency of the writ petition for (i) staying of Demand Notice No. VII(C)10/2023(SLES)-3664/Mines dated 27.11.2024 issued by the Deputy Director of Mines, Joda vide Annexure-9; and (ii) a direction that no coercive action should be taken against the Petitioner in respect thereof.

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8. That the Petitioner has a strong prima facie case and the balance of convenience lies in favour of the Petitioner, and unless the relief as prayed for is granted, the Petitioner would be grossly prejudiced.





That this petition is *bonafide* and has been filed in the interests of justice.

PRAYER

In these circumstances, it is most respectfully prayed that this Hon'ble Court may graciously be pleased to pass an order directing the stay of Demand Notice No. VII(C)10/2023(SLES)-3664/Mines dated 27.11.2024 issued by the Deputy Director of Mines, Joda vide Annexure-9, and may further be pleased to direct the Opposite Parties to not take any coercive action against the Petitioner during the pendency of the writ petition;

And/or pass any other or further order (s) as deemed just and proper in the facts and circumstances of the case.

And for this act of kindness, the Petitioner shall as in duty bound ever pray.
